

TEACHER BEHAVIOURS ESSENTIAL FOR ESL STUDENTS LEARNING TO WRITE IN ENGLISH (Ramirez, 1995)

- 1. Keep the writing task clear, simple and straightforward.
- 2. Teach the writing process.
- 3. Analyze and diagnose a writing product.
- 4. Establish short term and long term goals for each student.
- 5. Balance classroom activities, providing some for individuals and some for groups.
- 6. Develop meaningful assignments.
- 7. Provide a real audience, one other than the teacher.
- 8. Make student papers available to students, allowing students to see their own work develop.
- 9. Move from the known to the unknown, utilizing the students' previous knowledge.
- 10. Provide writing activities that reinforce reading, listening, and speaking skills.
- 11. Provide heuristics for invention, purpose and audience.
- 12.Outline clearly the goals for each writing assignment.
- 13. Teach the conventions of spelling, punctuation, and capitalization.
- 14.Teach the principles rules, conventions, and guidelines of writing
 as a means to develop thoughts, order ideas, and communicate these ideas in a significant way.
