# 1. School updates.

Black history month.

Vancouver schools are following different paths respecting and reflecting on **February's Canada-wide Black History Month**. In addition to our teacher's ongoing classroombased discussions that continuously builds our school's culture of respecting diversity and anti-racism, this month we do have two initiatives that focus specifically on the African experience.

The first is a school-wide Teams-based **formal school assembly** with a guest speaker reflecting on his experiences as a child in Rwanda and his journey to Canada. The second event is an outreach to our feeder elementary schools ...

Our Drama department picked up Ngugi wa Thiongo's (2020) *The Perfect Nine* (an epic poem describing the origins of wa Thiongo's people, the Gikuyu- one of the nation's constituting the Kenyan Federation), and are facilitating 19 of our students in grades 8-12, of different backgrounds, reading the entire epic in daily episodes during February. Readings are recorded and uploaded to a closed channel shared with Maple Grove and McKechnie ... and Edith Cavell who are currently in the swing space site. Grade 6/7 teachers are using the readings as part of their program; Grade 1-3 parents could use the readings as part of a bed-time story routine. 
