Byng Athletics Track and Field : BC Multi-event Championships

Congratulations to the three Lord Byng athletes who competed in the BC High School Multi-event Track and Field Championships on Friday and Saturday in Langley. The athletes braved horrendous weather at times, and two days of intense competition.

Elise Trinder placed 10th in the Junior Girls heptathlon, despite never having competed in a number of the events before. Nevertheless, she gained valuable experience for the future.

Maiya Gurbin placed 6th in the Senior Girls heptathlon. She was in medal contention on the first day but after a controversial decision she was disqualified in the 200 meters. Despite a strong effort in her remaining events, she could not get back in the medal hunt. On a positive note, Maiya overcame illness and injury this year, just to get there and she won the ultimate race of getting to the Chan Centre on time to get her diploma.

Finally, Maclean Carlson won the bronze medal in the Jr. Boys Octathlon. He was in the race for a medal throughout the two days. He was 15 points behind with one event to go. He gutted it out with an impressive 1000 meter run to place 3rd by 30 points!

Next up is the BC Championships for all of the individual events and relays, back in Langley, this Thursday to Saturday.
