#### What is Career Education?

Career Education consists of two courses completed between grades 10 and 12. They are Career Life Education and Career Life Connections.

- Career-Life Education focuses on gaining a clear understanding of career-life development knowledge, skills, and strategies for life's journey into adulthood and is often completed in grade 10.
- Career-Life Connections
  focuses on applying personal
  career-life management
  knowledge, skills, and
  strategies to the one's own
  personal life journey, and
  includes designing,
  assembling, and presenting a
  capstone to an audience,
  celebrating the learning
  journey and next steps toward
  preferred futures. It is often
  completed in grade 12.

# Are graduation requirements the same as university/college entrance requirements?

No. Students must complete all graduation requirements to receive a 'Dogwood Certificate' or graduation certificate.

However, post-secondary institutions set their own entry requirements. Each faculty within these institutions may also require specific courses.

Students work with their teacher-counselor to create a plan that meets their individual needs.

Important Information about Graduating from Secondary School

## What are graduation requirements?

Graduation requirements are the specific grade 10,11 and 12 secondary school courses that every student must take to get a "Dogwood Diploma" These requirements consist of:

- mandatory, or required courses, set by the Ministry of Education;
- <u>elective</u> courses chosen by individual students; and
- two literacy and one numeracy assessment.

Each course has a set number of credits. A student needs 80 credits to graduate. Most courses are worth four credits. The 80 credits include:

- 52 credits of mandatory courses;
- 28 credits of elective courses.
- Literacy and numeracy assessments must be completed but are not credited.

### Which courses are mandatory at each grade level?

The following table shows which courses the Ministry of Education **requires** at each grade level. There are often many options of each type of 'COURSE' depending on grade level. For example Science courses include Biology Chemistry and Physics, among others.

### What are elective courses?

These are courses chosen by students based on interest. The number and kind of elective courses available will vary from school to school. These courses may be developed by an individual board of education, but all are approved by the Ministry of Education.
