Late Returns in September

Any students not returning to school on September 7, 2022, must notify the office of the date they expect to return in order to hold their place in classes. If we have not received information about a late return, students may be withdrawn from their classes and the school. Please complete a late return form available in the office and on the website (HERE).

Daily Health Checks

Although there are no formal protocols, we encourage all students and staff to complete a daily health check. If you feel unwell, stay at home. Parents and caregivers are responsible for assessing their children daily before sending them to school. School administrators will ensure staff and other adults know they are responsible for assessing themselves daily for symptoms prior to entering the school.

Masks

Although masks are not required, we remain a mask friendly environment. It continues to remain a personal choice for staff and students to wear a mask.

Lunch

Lunch service in the cafeteria will begin on **Wednesday September 7th**, **2022.** Students will be able to eat lunch on site, but we continue to encourage students to utilize our outdoor spaces (garden, front lawn) to maximize physical distancing.

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Lunchsmart

Lunchsmart[™] is available to help students who require help with nutrition services at school. Healthy eating helps children learn. Lunch is provided daily at the school cafeteria. Families may purchase a Lunchsmart[™] card and pay the full amount each month. A limited government subsidy is available from CommunityLINK for students who require help with nutrition services at school. To register for the program and/or apply for a subsidy from CommunityLINK, please come to the school office to pick up a form and envelope.

COLLABORATIVE PLANNING TIME

This year the Vancouver School Board calendar will include eight (8) days on which the school day is shortened for students. The school day remains the same length for school staff. These periods of time, called Collaboration Planning Time, provide the opportunity for school staff to come together to engage in activities and discussions specific to their unique school community to support and enhance student progress and achievement. During Collaboration Planning Time, teachers work directly with peers within the school setting to share, discuss, and learn from each other to enhance their teaching practice within the "Four Pillars" of education:

During Collaborative Planning Times, students are not expected to be at school. To ensure that instruction is equitable during all periods, some Collaborative Planning Times will be scheduled in the morning during the AM- Period 1(8:40 AM – 10:00 AM) or the PM- Period 4 (1:45 PM – 3:07 PM) As a reminder, the Provincial government sets out minimum hours of instruction for all grade levels. The Vancouver School Board calendar, with Staff Collaboration Planning Time included, still meets all Provincial requirements.

FLEXIBLE INSTRUCTIONAL TIME (FIT)

For the second year, FIT time will be included in the bell schedule for secondary schools in Vancouver. FIT happens two times per week, 50 minutes on:

- Tuesday mornings (9:40 AM 10:30 AM)
- Thursday afternoon (1:15 PM to 2:05 PM).

FIT is intended for student support and other learning opportunities. We appreciate the students, families and staff that participated in the feedback surveys last school year. We have utilized this information to improve the FIT model for the 2022-23 school year.

In the fall, teachers will communicate with students how to best utilize this time in support of their academic success. Vancouver Technical Secondary, along with the VSB, is excited that this year's schedule incorporates flexibility and remains committed to continuing the work and conversations around structures that best support learning for all students.

Details:

- This is school time (instructional time) and students get a choice of how to spend it doing school work or student interest activities.
- For example, students may participate in weekly classes, collaborate with peers, see individual teachers, or pursue learning activities that may fall outside of their scheduled classes
- Staff and supports will be available for students.
- All students are expected to be in a school space with a teacher
- You will need to sign up for sessions each week via http://vantech.myweeklyplanner.net

REPORTING INFORMATION & DATES

Students receive report cards that include grades, work habits and comments providing families with the students' current progress in their courses throughout the year.

In addition to report cards, teachers *may* provide students with important notices and anecdotal subject reports that parents should review. If your child receives an Incomplete/In Progress Report (also known as an "I" Report) for any of their classes, it is crucial that they connect with their teacher(s) to develop a plan to complete the missed work. Please note, that all work must be submitted prior to the end of the semester to be assessed and evaluated for the Final Semester Report unless specified by the teacher.

Please note, your child's report card is <u>electronic</u> and will be published to their MyEducation BC account. It is recommend that you download and save a copy for future reference.
