

- Children can experiment, investigate and inquire in ways that are relevant and meaningful to them, when they are provided with opportunities to enriched and deepened their relationships with place, land and community (Early Learning Framework, 2019).
- Play is an approach to inquiry and a way to research the world. By providing diverse materials and experiences, adults create spaces for children to experiment and transform.

Activity—Loose Parts

- Loose parts are objects or materials that offer unlimited play possibilities for early learners.
- It can be made of different materials like wood, plastic, glass or paper. Loose parts can be found in nature like leaves, stones, sticks, flowers and seashells.
- Go outside and collect items like rocks, pinecones and tree bark. Inside your home, use items like egg cartons and toilet paper rolls.
