other schools for the remainder of the year.



We are looking for families to help water our garden boxes during the summer months when students and staff are not attending school. Please contact your child's teacher if you are interested. Thank you.


Enjoy the last weekend in April and hopefully we will see even warmer weather in May.



The Big One at Two

On Thursday, May 5, the VSB is participating in the "Big One at Two" earthquake drill. Schools are asking parents to come at 2:15 p.m. to pick up their children and participate in the reunification portion of our drill. We did this in October but only a handful of parents were able to participate so we did not get a true sense of how things may unfold. When you arrive at the school at 2:15 p.m. (preferably no sooner) please do not enter the school grounds, instead, look for the "Check in" table where you will be asked to provide picture ID and sign in. You will be given a slip of paper with your child's name and division number on it, and then asked to walk around to the "Student Release" table where a runner will go and collect your

child to go home for the day. We ask that as many parents as possible come for this practice (of course, if you are working and are not able to do so we do understand). Thank you for helping us prepare for a day when a reunification such as this may be needed.
