# When I have a question or concern



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# **PREAMBLE**

In the course of carrying out their duties, the Board's employees are required to make many decisions affecting the education, health and safety of a student.

There may be a question or concern regarding such decisions.

The purpose of these guidelines is to ensure a safe and respectful working and learning environment while addressing a concern.

### **GUIDING PRINCIPLES**

When a concern does arise it is important that the people involved commit to resolving the situation in a manner of mutual respect that does not interfere with:

- the teacher's delivery of the educational program of the classroom;
- the management and operation of the school;



- the privacy of the individuals involved; and
- the student's ability to solve problems.

# **PROCESS**

1. Concerns are best handled and resolved as close to the origin as possible.

#### 2. If there is a concern:

- Arrange a time to discuss the concern with the person involved, give the reason and clarify who is attending.
- Organize your thoughts, clarify the concerns and stay focussed on it.



- If assistance is required by any of the parties involved, you could consider outside resources such as a resource person, a parent advocate, an interpreter or a union or association representative.
- Communicate respectfully and maintain confidentiality.
- Listen and commit to understanding the issue fully.
- Occasionally it is not possible to come to a mutually agreed upon course of action. Take time to reconsider the concern. It may be necessary to agree to disagree.
- 4. This protocol should not conflict with other protocols and policies that may necessitate different courses of action.
