- 3. Treasurer's Report

  - Currently have about ~\$10-12,000 to disperse in the next round; will look at this at the May meeting for items for the fall use
  - Heard that next year's gaming allotment will be the same
  - Have learned that we may not need a separate bank account for gaming anymore looking at closing to save the fees

- Currently serving on committee looking at Framework for Enhanced Student Learning; comes from a ministry directive
- 5. Teacher Rep Report (Angela Bigiolli)
  - Thank you for funding provided
  - Seeking some clarification for May PAC meeting requests are for September use?
    - o Yes
  - English Dept member request Ashley Adamson here for request for Q4
    - o Hoping to make hallways more creative spaces
    - o So many grade nine English classes this quarter
    - Bring them together, along with Summit 10
    - Have them bring up favourite novels
    - Paint each locker as spine of the books
    - Hope is that other wings of the school will take this up and paint lockers in themes of subjects
    - Some delay in getting the lockers ready; some funding has come from Principal's budget; also waiting to hear about funding from Home Depot
    - o Hoping PAC can support this as well
    - Total costs for 150 lockers would be about \$2000; still needing \$1500
  - Discussion & questions

Motion: To fund \$1,250 to the English Department for locker painting as spines of books M/S/C

- 6. Principal's Report (Robert Moro)
  - Q4 changes came into effect today
  - Had some students lost but found their way
  - Grade 8/9s coming in every day and have option to attend both AM & PM
  - Grade 10-12s option of coming in on Tues & Thurs during flex time; teacher has option to have them come in or do a remote lesson
  - Q3 marks coming out on May 3<sup>rd</sup> published to MyEd
  - Decided on grad dates June 16/17, over two evenings similar to last year and looking at streaming live
  - Week prior is a Grad Week with some events for Gr 12s
  - Student Council doing a drive for families in need
  - Fine Arts week with various activities
  - District announced looking at semester model; all depends on situation with virus
  - Last night VSB passed motion to end VPD School Liaison Officer program; will lead to some changes; "hope VSB & VPD can redesign another program"
  - District announced administration moves for next year; Van Tech affected Sonja is becoming a Principal (Hudson elementary); we will get Richard Edge as a new VP, he is currently a Counsellor at John Oliver

- Q: For Grad fee, what are we getting? Is it the same fee as a typical year?
  - Decorations, photo, streaming, recording, gown, etc.
  - o Typical year wouldn't have filming but would be in a different venue
  - Costs of streaming balanced out to venue
- Special topic #1: School Growth Plan (Sonja Rondestvedt)
  - Hoping for feedback from parents
  - Slide deck
  - o Growth plan was inherited by current administration
  - Currently have eight goals; typically, only focuses on 2-3
  - Themes within current goals
  - Students participated in online forum on growth plan and filled in surveys; students gave some great input on both content and survey design!
  - Interesting to be reading feedback
  - Also staff/teacher feedback
  - Got examples of how existing goals are living out
  - Trying to drill down to 2-3 goals
  - Shared some of the survey feedback; questions included: Do adults in the school treat all students fairly? Is school a place where you feel like you belong? At school, how many adults do you feel care about you?
  - See that many students feel a sense of belonging and being treated fairly; also learning that students may not know adults well but many remote
  - Also got feedback from staff on prioritizing current goals top ranking including fostering a sense of belonging; alleviating stress/anxiety; and creating a culture of care
  - Now coming to parents for feedback link will go on website and come out in school communique: <u>https://forms.office.com/r/jSxV8SRX6k</u>
- Q: How does this data compare to the Grade 10 Student Learning Survey data for Van Tech?
  - Pulled some questions from there and broadened it to other grades
  - Grade 10s felt less of a sense of belonging than current 8/9s interesting because we really focused on them because joining in a remote/pandemic year
  - o Still getting more data coming in so sifting through it
  - Were surprised how much Gr 8s have created an online community this year; believe this added to their sense of belonging
- Looking forward to hearing input from parents!
- Special topic #2: School and Course Fee Schedule; 2021-22
  - Shared on screen
  - Basically staying the same except Flex Humanities program; weren't certain if big field trip will happen, will deal with it if/when it happens
  - o District just sent out an email and can communicate to parents

- Note that planning on phasing out agenda book with move to electronic use
- If can't provide services/events due to pandemic we won't charge for them

Q&A with Mr. Moro

- *Q: Any word on Gr 9 immunizations* 
  - Unfortunately, still hadn't been contacted
  - Expected to hear from VCH about pop-up
  - Still haven't heard anything
  - If you do have a family doctor; suggest you contact them
  - Could roll this year's Gr 9s in with next year's if needed
- Q: Any update on the new track being put in by the city?
  - Ongoing project, Athletic Director working with them
  - Not sure about timeline but project is going ahead
- Q: What impact will the SLO decision have on Van Tech?
  - Won't know until look at it more closely
  - Understand that VPD might have SLOs not be in schools but be connected and supporting schools
  - VPD also run number of programs that support students; not sure which ones will continue
  - o Don't want to be presumptuous; up to VPD to decide what services will offer
  - Will impact the school from impact of having SLO there to talk to students, mentor them, and provide them with feedback; also does that with parents; one thing for students to hear from counsellor or administrator and another thing to hear from SLO; believe it is going to be a negative impact; time will tell; hope VSB can work with VPD and RCMP to support kids
- Q: Heard VPD talking about sex trafficking in schools; are we actually seeing that? Issue at Van Tech?
  - No; not aware of any direct association to our school
  - Sometimes see students need some kind of support
  - Lucky but doesn't mean not out there in community
  - Always need to be attentive to what's going on
- Q: Any issues with VSB budget, any impact on staffing? Get more folks in? Worried about losing staff that run specific programs?
  - This point getting course requests in order
  - Now starting to allocate blocks of time to cover
  - Will take shape and then determine need for courses, teachers, etc.
  - Getting our staffing this Friday so we can know what changes/adjustments need to make
  - For both teaching and school-based resource
  - Understand it is going to be tight across the district
  - So far don't see losing any specialized teachers or putting programs in jeopardy
- *Q: Will classes go right to June 29?*

- Marks due a bit sooner but classes will be in session
- Figuring out last couple days if need to help students wrap up items
- Might be adjustment to schedule for that if needed
- *Q: When will Q3 final marks to on MyEd?* 
  - May 3<sup>rd</sup> is the goal
  - Gave teachers some extra time and extra time for students to hand in materials
- Q: If VSB comes up with a schedule for linear classes in semester model? Have you discussed what might be linear/full year model?
  - Meeting tomorrow to figure out details and also waiting for District to give information on linear courses but also something like this year's "flex time"
- Once we know then we can discuss as staff to see what courses would best be linear
- 7. Open Discussion
  - Discussed the end of the SLO program; shared variety of perspectives
  - Discussed keeping PAC meetings online even after the pandemic to make it more convenient; maybe occasionally do in person to socialize and meeting each other
    - $\circ$  Have guests, presenters, etc. to drive up attendance
