Some Unacceptable Behaviours

- Hurtful words or backtalk
- Rude body language or tone of voice
- Excluding others
- Vandalism
- Pushing, hitting, kicking
- Dangerous play
- Disruptive noise
- Littering
- Cheating, stealing
- Not following rules and expectations
- Bullying, harassment, retaliation (revenge)
- Destruction or damage to property
- Inappropriate internet use
- Interfering with learning of others or the smooth running of the school
- Possession or use of illegal or restricted substances, real or fake weapons and other items of concern (eg. Lighters, firecrackers)
- Please do not send expensive items (or large sums of money) to school without prior approval from school staff. The school will not take responsibility for these items being lost, stolen, or damaged.

Consequences

The school takes seriously behaviour that discriminates as outlined in the BC Human Rights Code. Consequences are intended to be consistent, preventative, fair, supportive, and restorative. The severity and frequency of acceptable conduct as well as age and maturity are considered in determining disciplinary action. Special considerations may apply to students with special needs.

Examples of some consequences

Level 1 – Minor Infractions: Problem solving discussion with the classroom teacher and others

Level 2 – Repeated Misbehaviour As in level 1 plus... Infraction recorded Loss of privileges eg. Playground, removal of possession eg. toy School Community Service Staff/Parents informed as needed

Level 3 – Serious Problems Refusal or inability to change As in Level 1 and 2 plus... Administration informed Behaviour/Safety Plan as needed Suspension in accordance with VSB Policy

Notification/Supports
