## WHAT'S NEW

New Program! Concurrent Education/Kinesiology: In September 2024, we will have a new direct entry ConEd/Kinesiology program. Available for the Intermediate/Senior teaching level only; teaching subjects will be Health and Physical Education in combination with one additional teachable subject - either Biology, Chemistry, Geography or Math.

STS - OUAC Process: Required to Submit Transcripts: Beginning last year, BC curriculum applicants to Queen's must connect their STS file to OUAC. On their OUAC application, they will include their PEN, and after submitting their OUAC application, they will select OUAC on their STS portal. The transcript that STS sends to OUAC will show interim grades as well as course enrollments that have been reported to the Ministry. When updated interim/midterm/enrollments are submitted, they will appear on STS and be transmitted to OUAC on an ongoing basis. This ensures grade updates are sent on an ongoing basis to OUAC, which then sends electronically directly to us. It will require that all current and future course enrollments are sent to the Ministry. This change has simplified the transcript process and allows for faster admission decisions.

Commitment Scholars: The Commitment Scholars Award celebrates and recognizes demonstrated leadership in, and commitment to, racial justice, social justice, or diversity initiatives by a student in their high school or in their community. Eligible candidates will be entering first year of any first-entry undergraduate degree program, who self-identify on the application as a member of an underserved or underrepresented group, including Black, Indigenous and other racialized students, persons with disabilities, and LGBTQ2S+ individuals. Application deadline is 15 February 2023.
