Author's Last name, First name. "Title of the source." Title of the

first container (i.e. the original source), First Name and Last

Name of any contributors, Version, Numbers, Publisher,

Publication Date, Location. Name of Database, URL or DOI.

Access Date (if applicable).

- Access Date is not required if the resource is an encyclopedia or book, but is recommended when no copyright date (i.e. publication date) is provided, or when information in the database changes frequently. Always place it at the end of the citation.
- If any of the information is missing, simply move on to the next part of the citation.
- Remember to review all the General Rules that appear on the "Citing Resources MLA style" page.
