

Orange shirt Day



Wednesday, September 29th is the day that the VSB Orange Shirt Day, a day to recognize and remember the residential school experience. It is a day in recognition of the harm the residential school system did to Indigenous children's sense of self-esteem and well being, and as an affirmation of our commitment to ensure that everyone around us matters.

The September 30 was the date that was chosen as the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation because it is the time of year in which children were taken from their homes to residential schools, and it also provides educators an opportunity to

foster dialogue and deepen their understanding of Indigenous People's histories for the coming school year.

Orange Shirt Day is also an opportunity for Indigenous and Non-Indigenous people, local governments, schools and communities to come together in the spirit of reconciliation and hope for generations of children to come.

Everyone is invited to wear an Orange shirt to school on Wednesday, September 29th.

School Cash Online



The Vancouver School Board now has School Cash Online as its preferred method of payment for all school fees, including everything from field trips to yearbooks. This secure system helps parents/guardians and community members pay schoolrelated fees safely, quickly and easily online.

The new system puts all of the school fees available to your student online for purchase, keeping you informed of your child's activities and needs. We will post items through the system and assign the relevant fees to your child. You can then choose to purchase these fees online with one of three different methods, including credit cards. You can also stay informed and keep track of which school fees require your attention. The system strictly adheres to Canada's privacy and anti-spam legislation and meets the latest industry standards for payment

security.

GENERAL \$35.00 SUPPLY FEE



The Vancouver School Board offers the service of purchasing basic school supplies in bulk at wholesale prices and passing the cost savings on to families. The School Supply Fee for 2020 - 2021 is \$35.00 per student*.

This fee covers basic consumable school supplies used for students' personal use such as paper, writing tools, glue sticks, erasers, exercise books and art supplies. Supplies are provided for the full year.

Student Agenda/Planner/Folder – \$6

Agenda/Planner/Folder. will be using an agendas/planners/folders are a valuable tool for teaching children how to organize and plan for school. While students are not required to have an agenda/planner/folder it is designed to assist students with the skills of organization and time management and is a very useful communication tool often used between teachers and families.

Performance Fee – Fully Funded by False Creek PAC

We are pleased to enrich your child's learning through a wide variety of performances this year. This supplementary fee supports the school in bringing in talented and professional theatrical and musical performers that align with a particular educational theme. Parent support has made these opportunities possible and we appreciate your continued contribution.

Activity Fee for IXL – \$7

This year we will continue to offer IXL online enrichment Math activities. Other activities will be offered and charged separately through Cash Online, as program bookings are confirmed thoughout the year. These programs are subsidized by the False Creek Parent Advisory Committee (PAC). We appreciate your continued contribution.

Workbooks - \$15

This year, several classes will be using the JumpMath workbooks to supplement the classroom math program. The workbook is available for purchase at the cost of \$15. Students are not obligated to purchase the workbook, and may opt to use their copy as a reference textbook instead, meaning the workbook will be returned at the end of the school year for another student to use in the future. Students opting to use the workbook as a textbook will be responsible for ensuring that it remains unmarked and in excellent condition in order to return the workbook at the end of the year.

Outdoor School Fees for grades 6/7- \$250 (Approximate)

At this time overnight fieldtrips are not allowed. However, if this changes, upper intermediate classes may go on an overnight camping field study later in the school year. This experience allows them to learn about the outdoors while developing independence and leadership skills. This fee covers the cost of the camp, supervision, and transportation.

Throughout the school year your child's teacher may plan supplementary learning opportunities at locations outside of the school and request monies towards entrance fees, transportation or equipment rental. Your child's teacher will communicate this information to you directly.

FINANCIAL HARDSHIP

As a reminder, the Vancouver School Board will not deny a child access to the school supplies required for his or her educational program because of financial hardship. Nor will any child be excluded from activities where a fee is charged. If at any time there is a financial challenge, please contact the school Principal, (Maria Donovan). All requests will be treated confidentially.


