- 5. Principal's Report (Rob Moro)
 - Marks due tomorrow and available on MyEd on Friday, April 29th
 - Teacher conferences will be online and similar to last semester where you can book 7 minute sessions with teachers booking online will be available on Monday, May 2nd
 - Earthquake drill on Wednesday, May 4th
 - Tech day April 27th pooled four FIT sessions into one day and it's an opportunity for students to partake in assemblies or sessions available during the day. Tech day also allows for the Grade 12's to complete ministry assessment exams or survey (collect information around aspects of the school to make school a better place)
 - o Grade 8's have assembly in first period, indigenous storytelling other periods
 - o Grade 9's internet safety
 - o Grade 10's assembly and other sessions throughout the day
 - o Assembly theme is a panel ranging from Indigenous elders, Randy Clark, Black settlers, alumni of Van Tech, students run and ask questions of the panel. A Lot of support from staff in organising.
 - Parents are welcome to come to the school again.
 - Sending out a Grade 12 bulletin on all you want to know about graduation orpheum booked and dinner dance at Pan Pacific, gowns orders, choosing valedictorian
 - Athletics Grade 8 and Grade 9 boys playing in tournaments parents watching
 - Question: Is it possible to invite guests to the grad?
 - It's an event for grade 12's and they would like to keep it to their students and look at maintaining students only and not inviting guests. Bringing guests is problematic and you have to do checks on others including age, layers of supervision. Is it a change going forward? It varies from school to school.
 - Question: Dry grad? Is there a dry grad in place? Some secondary schools parents organise the events?
 - o Every school does something different. It's not common.
 - Question: Are parents allowed to show at the prom and take pictures?
 - o The dinner and dance and cross security and parents don't have access but outside of the hotel and lobby the parents can come up to the edge of the entrance. Bulletin will be sent out about grade 12 graduation.

- Question: There seems to be fire alarms constantly at school and it's disruptive. School administration can't do anything about it. What are you doing to prevent fire alarms being pulled?
 - o Frustrating and there are safety issues. The trustees are not in favour of cameras but a special request to use cameras temporarily. Other situation is that an area of the school is that there is a new stations that have plastic covers you can pull it up and the traditionally there is glass that needs to break and in process that they change the plastic covers. If we see anyone on grounds that is not a student they are asked to leave.
 - o A message to the students broadcast about how disruptive it is when fire alarms are pulled and not confident if its students or others that are entering the school that don't attend.
- Question: Graffiti in the girls bathroom and there could be an educational program.
 - Lock the area immediately and operations paint the area. Follow up with any information and take photos. Take it very seriously. Do you take it as an educational opportunity? Haven't done anything at this point directly related to the incident but have other programs on anti-racism and bullying.
- Question: Are spectators allowed for sporting events?
 - The stands are open and accessed through side doors on the main parking lot to access the gym.
- Question: Child was joyous about formal dance and has heard that it is being cancelled due to the fire alarms, is that the reason?
 - o Miscommunication as the dance is delayed and the grad committee has to come forward with a date.
