- Tweet it. Blog it. Comment on others’ sites.
- You become an author by posting!

- It becomes public information -- to the world
- You have a huge responsibility in two major ways
 - **Content**
 - **Privacy**

- Play games/use apps?...**Who's following you?**

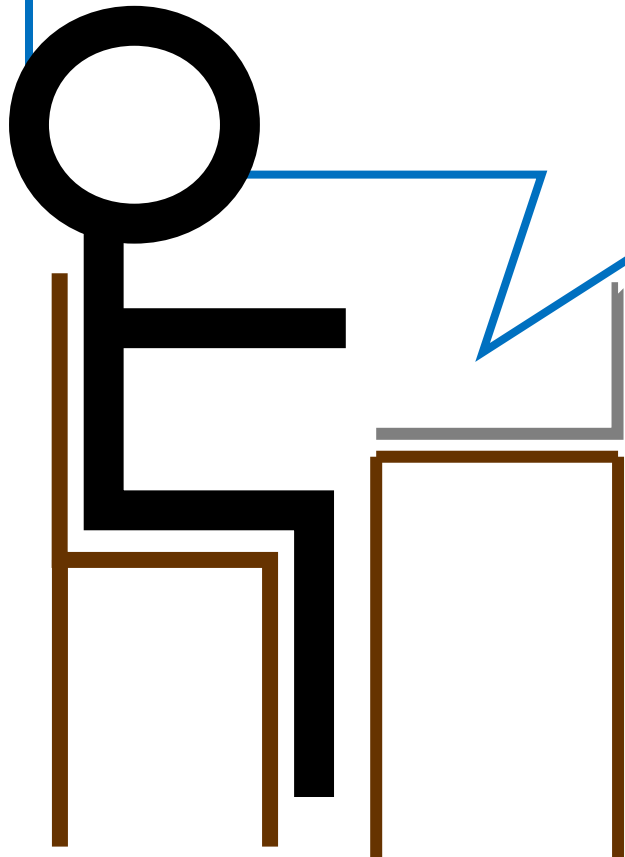
Think About Privacy

- Protect yourself. Protect others.

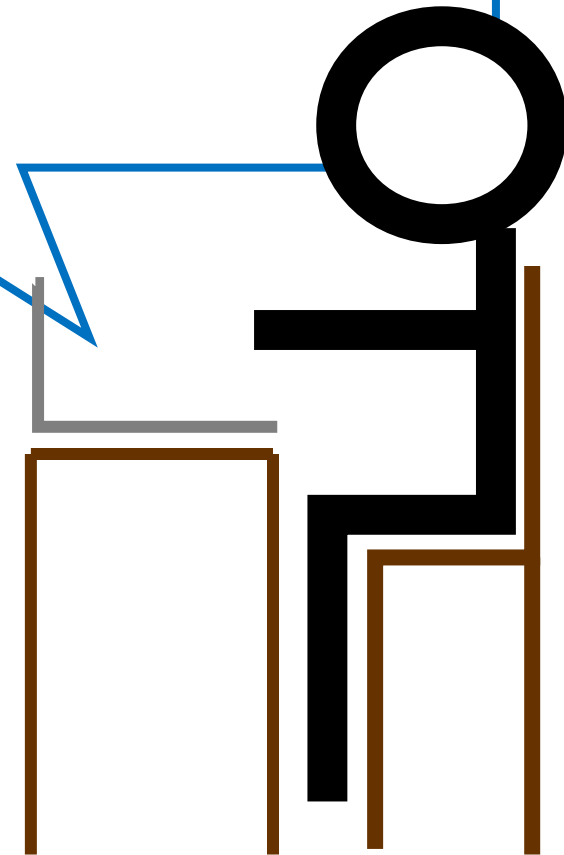


1. No real names

You Have a Responsibility to:

- **Be accurate**

Because:

So...

What to do on social media websites:

- Share photos?...**Create private albums**
- Post on your wall... **Share only with friends**
- Play games/use apps?...**Ask if they are okay**

The iPad Oath

- **Promise to ask permission to use the iPad**
- **Promise to ask permission to use the internet**
- **Promise to only visit websites my teacher has given permission to visit**
- **Always ask permission to have an app installed**
- **Promise to always tell my teacher if something goes wrong with the iPad**
