

- Guest Speakers: <u>SACY: Substance Use Health Promotion Initiative</u> (Natasha Gates, District Vice-Principal, Mental Health & SACY; Carmen Kaufmann, Parent and Family Engagement Coordinator, and Alexis Hemphill, Youth Engagement Worker)
 - Delivered in partnerships with VCH; piloted in 2006 and then expanded
 - Main focus substance use health promotion education and support; prevention and intervention; evidence-based
 - Three streams: School Environment; Youth Engagement; Parent Engagement
 - School Environment
 - o Collaborates with school-based staff; tailor needs to each school; support with activities and workshops
 - Youth Engagement (Alexis @ Van Tech)
 - o Workers assigned to secondary schools; shared schedule between two sites
 - Build positive connections classroom discussions, 1:1 and small group support, referrals, classroom discussions, support work and volunteer opportunities; coping skills
 - o Working with students, not against them; students can also contact via text
 - Parent Engagement (Carmen for Sumeet:Sumeet Ghuman: sumeet.ghuman@vch.ca
 - o Two workers for district
 - o Support caregivers and parents, connect with resources, offer workshops, relationship building
 - o Make it easy for family members and adapt to needs and changing realities (and brain development) for teens
 - o Tips: stay calm, be patient, listen (!) with an open mind and heart, be responsive rather than reactive, you don't have to have all the answers immediately (breathe!), provide appropriate limits, boundaries, and freedom depending on age and maturity of the child
 - o Involve your teen as much as you can to create rules together; support their hobbies and passions; be affectionate when they want it (words & actions); get to know your child's friends (knowing not judging); connect with other parents;

look after your own stress and ask for help when you need it - role model self care!

o Have fun with your teens, spend family time together, we learn with them
