Priority registration for Kindergarten to grade 7 closes at the end of January. While we still accept applications throughout the year, and make every effort to have all of our catchment students accepted at our school, we sometimes do not have space and we will have a waitlist. All waitlisted students will be offered a space as one becomes available before cross-boundary students. <u>The</u> <u>cross-boundary application process opens up on</u> <u>February 1st and closes at the end of February</u>. All Vancouver Public Schools, along with schools throughout British Columbia, continue to use the model of reporting to parents on a regular and pre-determined schedule to communicating student learning with parents on an on-going basis throughout the school year. Teachers in Vancouver have been working with the school district to provide parents with timely and responsive communications of student learning throughout the school year. Parents now receive five communications from teachers within a school year:



- a written progress report at the end of January
- a written summative report at the end of June
- a minimum of three ongoing communications of student learning in various subject areas (goal setting conferences in October were one example of this communication).

The written reports will include descriptive comments and a summary of student progress in relation to the learning standards from the BC Curriculum.
