Click on the left arrow to navigate backwards.5. When you are finished the survey, you will get a message "Thank you for sharing your views".


4. Britannia Library News


7. Message from the Wood and Robotics shops at Britannia:

Thank you to all the grade 8 families that participated in Woodshop/Robotics in quarter 2. We safely completed many projects and I hope you have a great time in your new classes. I am looking forward to increasing our skills and abilities together over the upcoming years. In grade 9-12 Wood we have been busy in the shop prepping for your arrival. We have a received a raw wood order with 4 species of wood for you to work with. Yesterday the VSB machinists finished doing safety checks, adjusting the machines to optimal conditions, and changing the cutting blades on many of our machines. So, the good news is we have a clean and safe shop with lots of material for us to work with. Traditionally in the shops we are used to wearing safety gear like masks, gloves, and hearing protection when needed. During finishing and sanding we do occasionally wear masks as well. We have a sink in the shop to regularly wash hands and lots of space to social distance and work independently with the current class sizes and rules with mask wearing. I have attached some photos of some wooden rings that I have been learning to make with epoxy and we have lots of design work that we can do at home, online, and face to face during this quarter.

In grade 9-12 Robotics we have been preparing the computers and robots for student arrival. This quarter we will be working with Lego EV3 robotics, Vex IQ robotics, and Rasberry PII arcade units. We also have an opportunity to program and work with software remotely and then operate the machines during our face-to-face time. At Britannia we have lots of opportunities and I hope that some of these photos will inspire families to talk about the future of technology in the workplace post pandemic. What will our jobs look like in the future? What type of technology excites you? What type of technology doesn't work for you? How do you keep yourself in the loop?

8. Changes for Quarter 3

As mentioned in previous communications, we are refining our quarter 3 schedules:

• Changes for Quarter 3 for Grade 8 students:

Students will continue to have class daily either 8:40-10:25 OR 1:18-3:03. In addition, 2 or 3 times per week, grade 8s will have an additional hour of class, 10:30-11:30 or 12:15-1:15. Counsellors will visit grade 8 classes on Tuesday and hand out paper copies of each grade 8 student's schedule. If a student is taking English and PE, their schedule might look something like this:

Students in grades 9-12 will also continue to have class daily either in the morning or the afternoon. Teachers will make clear their expectations when Quarter 3 begins.
