home a progress report (Friday February 1st)! W The report will be a strength-based snapshot of your child's learning during the first 5 months of the school year. In combination with conferences and other written or verbal communications that you may have already had with your child and/or your child's teachers, the report will most likely confirm your (and your child's) current understanding of their progress. Please use the report as a starting point for positive conversations with your child about his/her learning.

You may wish to:

- Ask your child to tell you more about the progress report comments that focus upon his/her strengths
- Look for the classroom teacher's suggestions for areas of growth and ways to support learning and make a goal with your child to support his/her growth
- Remember that a progress report is a snapshot it doesn't highlight <u>every</u> strength and/or ability
- Recognize and celebrate your child's hard work, learning and perseverance!

The progress report will also identify how a child is progressing in relation to grade level expectations for many subject areas. A competency scale will use descriptive words (beginning, developing, applying and extending) to identify how a child is progressing on their own learning continuum.
