

Going Away for Winter Vacation?

Are you travelling outside of Canada over the winter break or sooner? Fully vaccinated students, staff and other adults who have travelled outside of Canada *may* qualify for the fully vaccinated traveller exemption.

Currently, students, staff and other adults who are not fully vaccinated and have travelled outside of Canada CANNOT attend school for 14 days after arrival back in Canada, as part of <u>federal requirements</u>. This information is outlined on the Daily Health Assessment and applies to those children who cannot be vaccinated due to their age. Mandarin Bilingual Applications

Applications are currently being accepted for the Mandarin bilingual program at Trudeau. If your child is in grade three and you are interested in applying for this program for your child, please take a look at the <u>Vancouver School Board website</u> for more information about the program and the application process. Applications will be accepted until Monday, January 31 at 4:00 p.m. If we have more applications than spaces, there will be a draw.

**If you are applying for your child who will be going into grade 5, 6, or 7 an assessment would have to be completed to determine your child's level of Mandarin and if it would be sufficient to enter into the program.

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This year, Trudeau staff will focus once more on social responsibility for our school plan. In October, staff completed some baseline assessment and, throughout the year, we will implement strategies to help move students along the learning continuum in this area. The district has uploaded the current school plan to the Trudeau website. The staff determined in our October staff meeting that students at Trudeau continue to need the most

support in solving problems in peaceful ways. This is an area that we will continue to spend significant time on this year in the classroom and on the playground.



Kindergarten Registration Continues

As a reminder, the Kindergarten registration process is now open for the 2022—2023 school year. If you have a child born in 2017, you may apply for entry as follows:

- <u>Step 1</u>: Complete the online registration at <u>vsbapplynow.vsb.bc.ca</u>—print out the completed registration form.
- <u>Step 2</u>: Phone the school at 604-713-4865 to make an appointment to bring in the required documents. Entry to the school for registration purposes is by appointment only.
- <u>Step 3</u>: Bring the completed registration form along with the required documents to Trudeau.

NOTE: The registration process is not complete until you have completed all steps in the process. Priority registration for in-catchment students ends on January 31st. If we have more applications for kindergarten than we have available spaces, a draw will be held.

Safe Drop-off and Pick-up at School

Please note: it is important for the safety of all students that , if you are dropping your child off at school by car, you follow all city bylaws with respect to parking and driving around a school zone. This includes:

- Adhering to school-zone speed limits
- Adhering to no parking and/or no stopping signs around the school
- Parking on the correct side of the road when dropping off your child (there have been a number of cars that pull over and face the opposite direction than the traffic flow)
- We also ask that you do not attempt U-turns around the school, please drive the extra few meters and take another route rather than doing a U-turn

Following these signs and road rules will help to keep all of the children, parents, and community walkers safe during busy pick-up and drop-off times. Thank you.


