#### 9 ITEMS IN THIS E-BULLETIN

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### 1. Crowd Sourced Yearbook and Connection

## 2. Britannia Lunch and Breakfast Program

- Does the costume represent a culture that is not my own?
- Does the costume reduce cultural or identity differences to stereotypes?
- How would someone feel if they saw someone wearing their identity as a costume?

## 5. Graduation Numeracy and Literacy Assessments

All students on the new 2018 Graduation Program, are required to complete provincial assessments that will focus on the demonstration and application of their numeracy and literacy skills. For the 2020/21 school year, there are four sessions for students to complete the required graduation assessments.

November 2-6 We will be offering the Numeracy assessment for Gr 11 and 12 students who have not yet completed the assessment or who have chosen to re-write, as well as one Gr 10 class. ## 6. Britannia Code of Conduct Revised

The Vancouver School Board (VSB) is committed to a District code of conduct that upholds safe, inclusive, equitable, welcoming, nurturing and healthy school environments. To this end, the District code of conduct promotes clear behavioural expectations of respectful and responsible citizenship that lead to a culture of safety, caring and respect amongst everyone in our schools and programs and at all school-events and activities (p.1, <u>AP 350</u>). Effective September 2020, all school codes of conduct will include the following statement: "racism will not be tolerated in our school."
