ESL/ELL Teachers help me in many ways:

They speak more slowly and clearly.

Sometimes they let me use my home language with a classmate to help me with new ideas when I am really 'stuck'. I like this so I can show I really DO know things.

They give me examples and show pictures to help me understand.

They show me how the English language works.

They teach me new vocabulary every day.

They teach me how to get the most information possible from textbooks.

They often have examples of what a 'good' project or paper is supposed to look like.

They give me time to think before I answer questions in class.

They teach me strategies to help me take notes and study.

They really listen and try to understand me. Then they help me express my ideas in better English.

They know that learning in a new language is hard work so to give us a break, we sometimes have fun and play games to practice what we have learned.

They write things on the board while they are talking so I can better understand new ideas and vocabulary and remember them.

They give more marks for ideas than for grammar and spelling.

They check to make sure I understand even if I am too shy to ask for help.
