

# For the VSB Library Databases

1. Go to <https://library.vsb.bc.ca/>
2. Scroll to the bottom of the school list and click on University Hill Elementary
3. In the top right corner you'll see the login, click and fill out with Student ID (Pupil #) and password

From there you should see this window.

I've checked most of the databases and they should all be accessible after you've logged in, it's just click and go from there, however there are some that may require a login and or password.

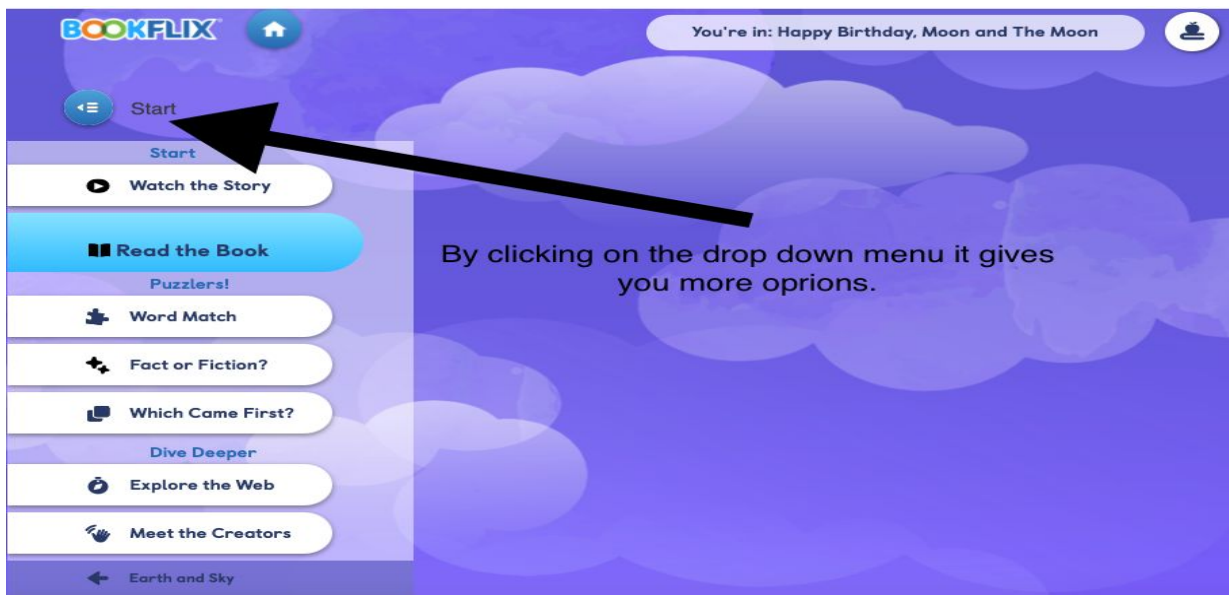

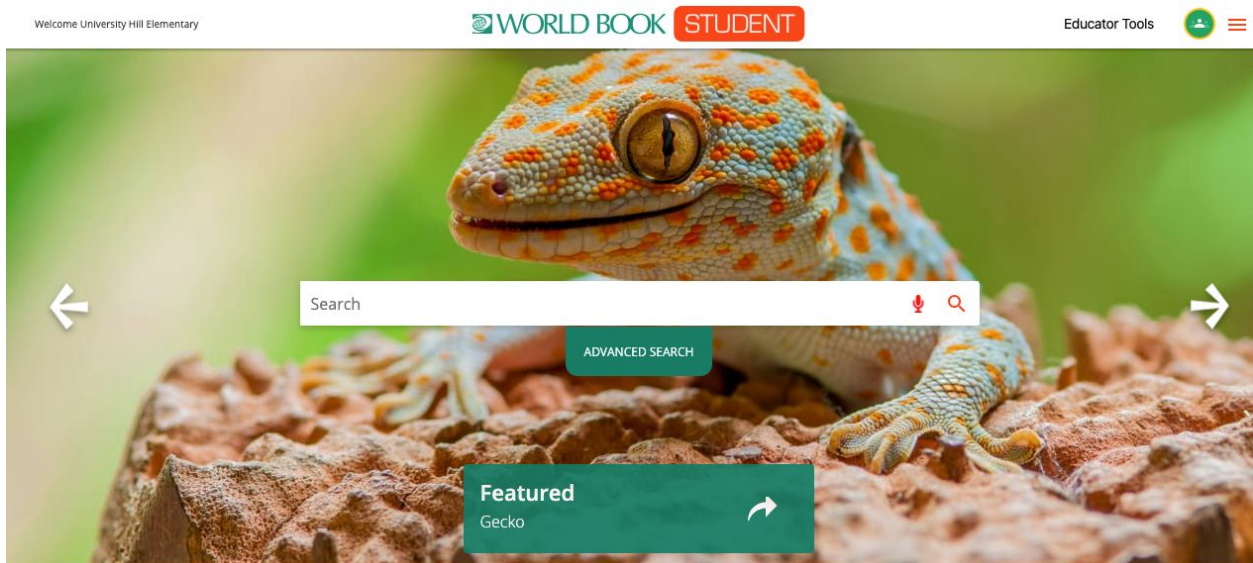
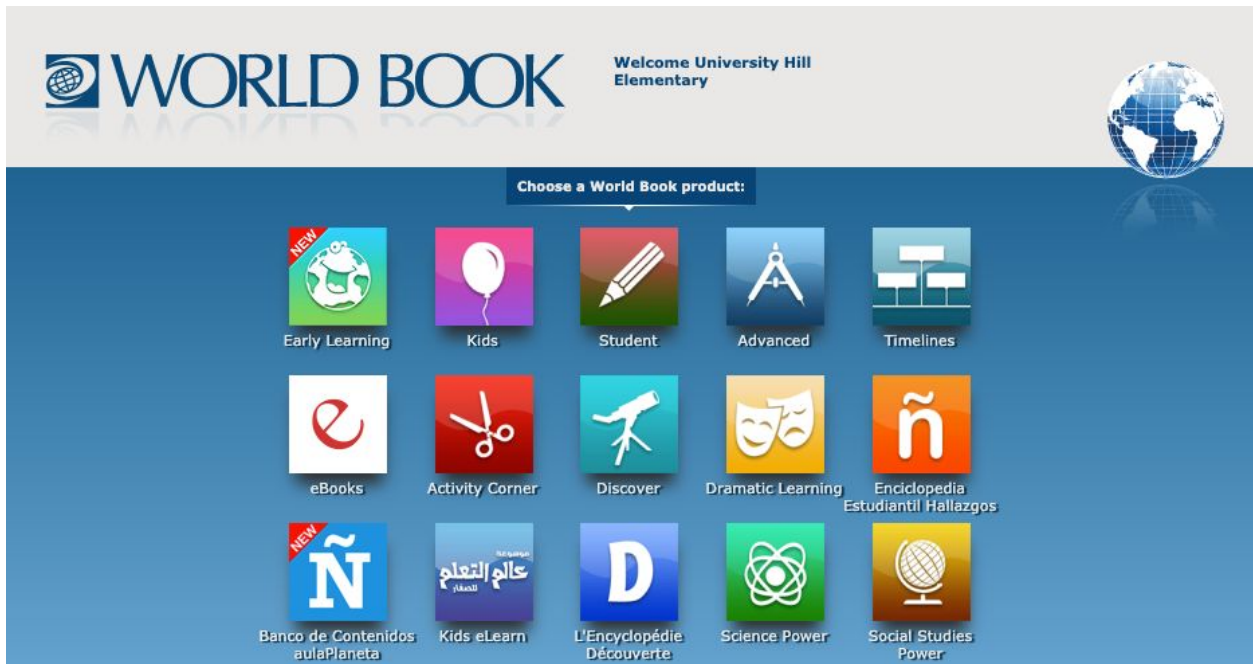

Some students have explored World Book with me in the library and will know how to navigate the database but it's very straight forward. World Book is a great online encyclopedia resource that allows students to research, discover and do activities. There are several different tabs within World Book such as Science Power and Social Studies Power which are both excellent resources that cover a wide range of topics and are filled with lesson plans, just click on a subject and follow the links. Another is Early Learners which is aimed towards K-1-2. World Book also offers ebooks in the eBook tab and has games and puzzles in the Kids tab. I encourage students to explore all the tabs to see what they offer. Here are some screenshots.

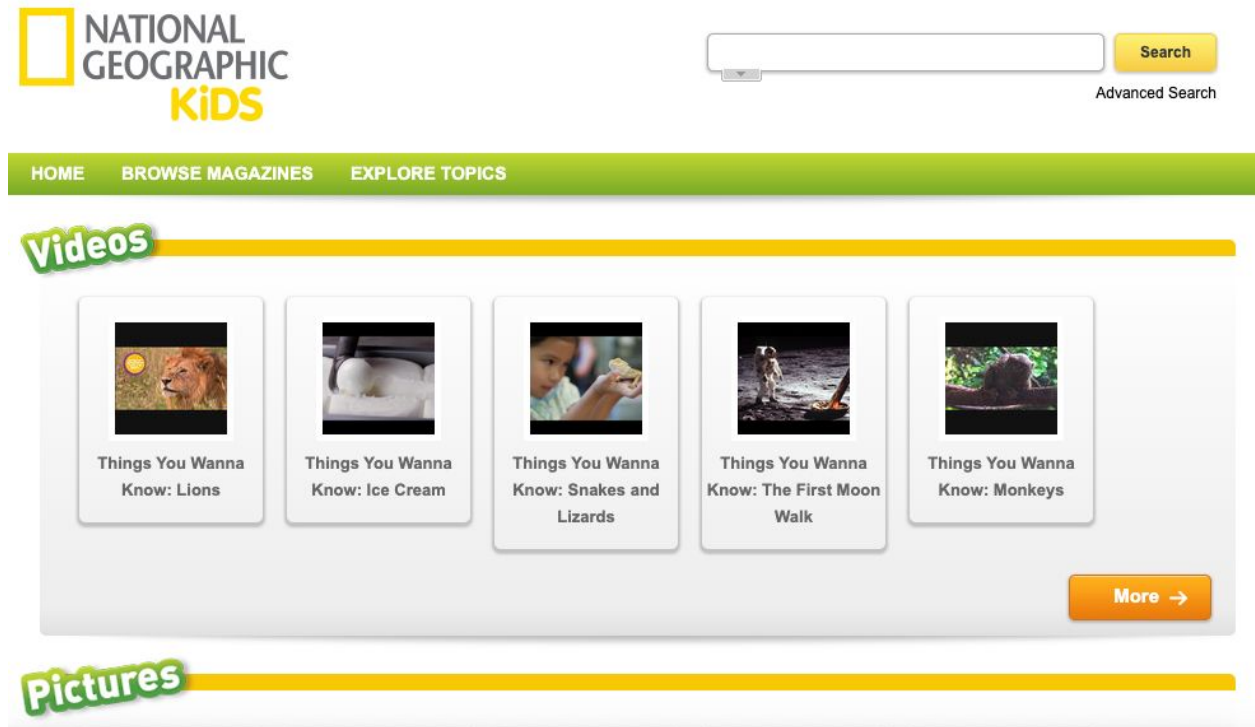

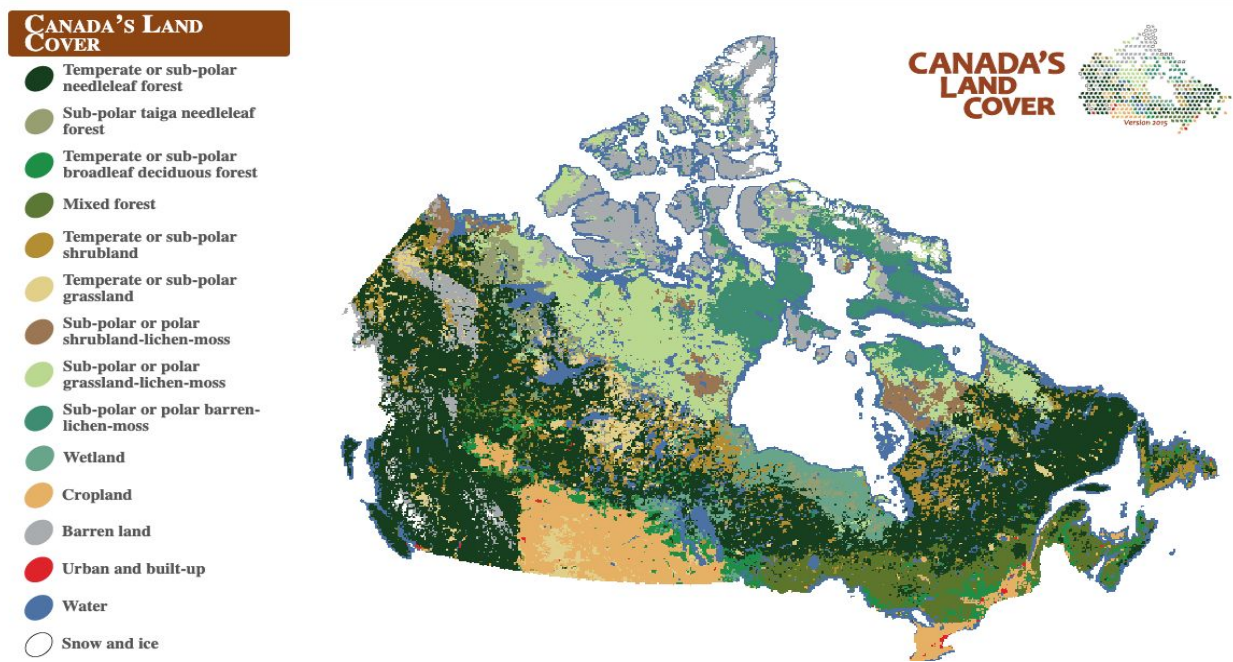

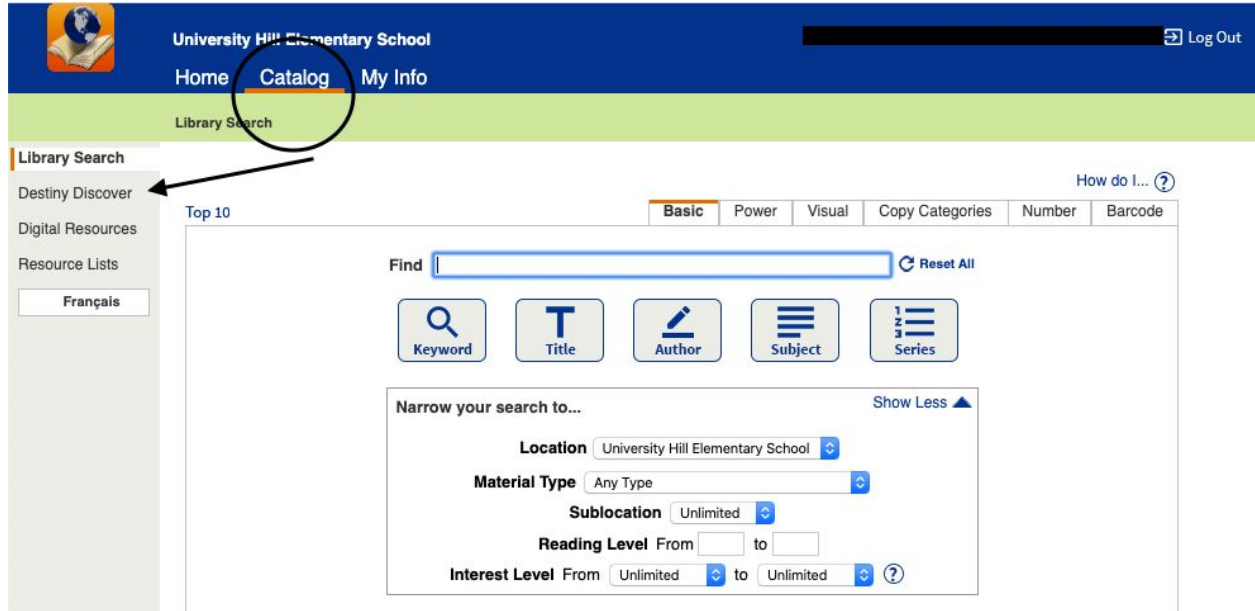
**FOX, TERRANCE STANLEY** (known as **Terry Fox**), marathon runner and cancer-research fundraiser; b. 28 July 1958 in Winnipeg, son of Rolland (Rolly) Murray Fox and Betty Lou Wark; d. 28 June 1981 in New Westminster, B.C.

Terry Fox was the second child of Rolly Fox, a switchman for Canadian National Railways, and his wife, Betty, a part-time worker in a card shop. He grew up with an older brother, Fred, and a younger brother and sister, Darrell and Judith. In the mid 1960s his family moved from Winnipeg to Vancouver, and then to Port Coquitlam, where he would spend the rest of his life. He had a normal childhood as a member of a middle-class, nuclear family, going to school and participating in sports. He was an avid competitor in any sport, but particularly in basketball. According to one of his high-school coaches, Bob McGill, he was not very skilled. at least initially. He was also short for a

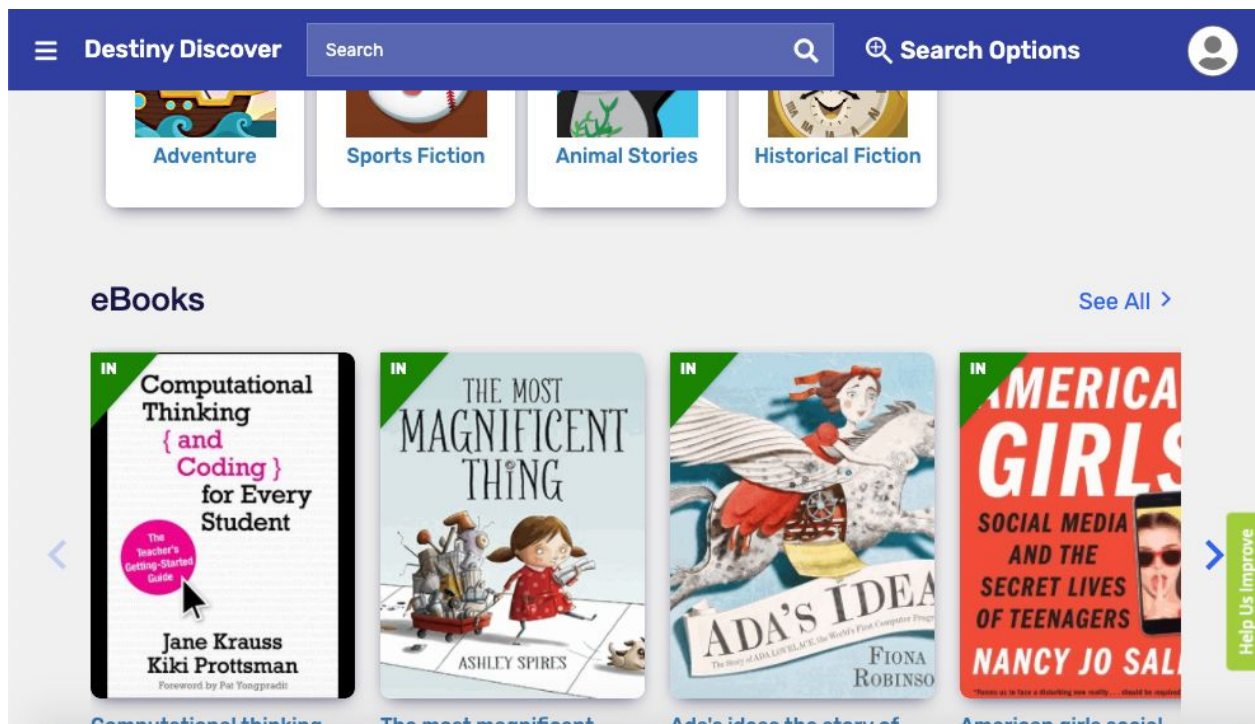

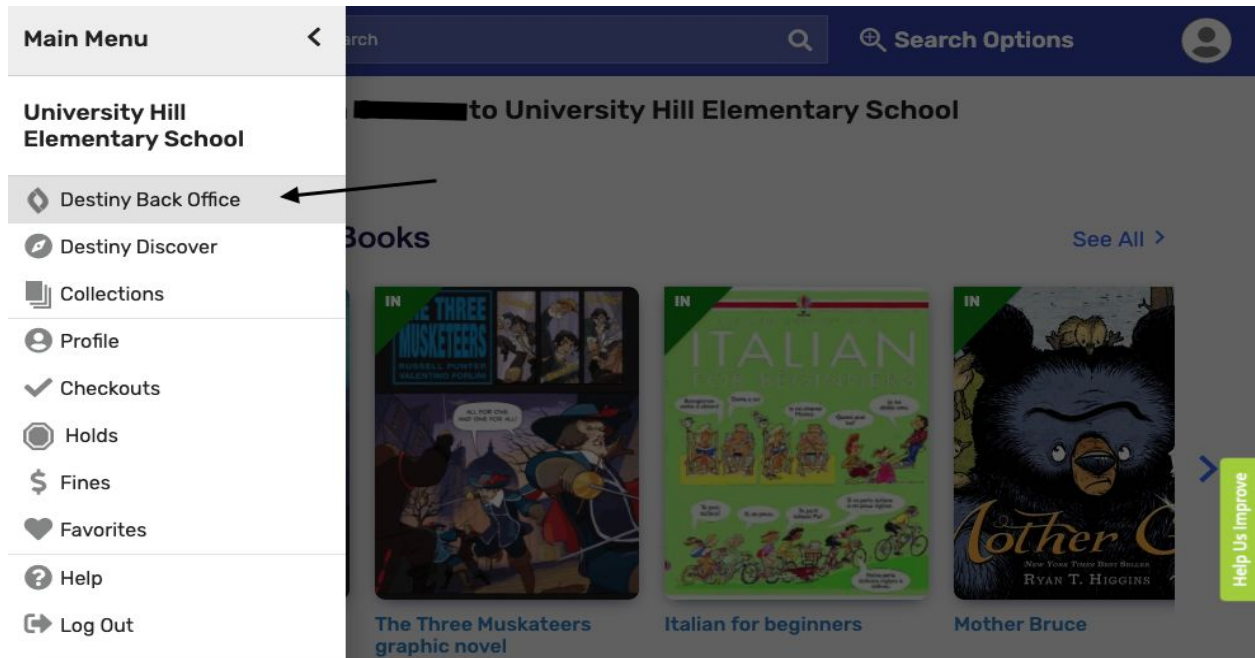
