Financial Hardship Policy

The Board of Education is committed to ensuring that no school-age student will be denied an opportunity to participate in a course, class or program because of an inability to pay fees. Parents and guardians unable to pay some or all school fees are invited to speak to their child's teacher, school counsellor, and/or the school Principal.

\$35.00 GENERAL SCHOOL FEE

The Vancouver School Board offers the service of purchasing basic school supplies in bulk at wholesale prices and passing the cost savings on to families. The School Supply Fee for 2023-2024 is \$35.00 per student*. This fee covers basic consumable school supplies used for students' personal use such as paper, writing tools, glue sticks, erasers, exercise books and art supplies. Supplies are provided for the full year.

SUPPLEMENTAL FEES

Student Agenda/Planner \$7.00	Students at Sir William Osler Elementary will be using an Agenda/Planner. School agendas/planners are a valuable tool for teaching children how to organize and plan for school. School agenda/planner is designed to assist students with the skills of organization and time management and is a very useful communication tool often used between teachers and families.
Performance Fee \$10.00	We are pleased to enrich your child's learning through a variety of performances this year. This supplementary fee supports the school in bringing in talented and professional theatrical and musical performers that align with a particular educational theme. Parent support has made these opportunities possible, and we appreciate your continued contribution.
Activity Fee \$20.00	This year the school will be booking activities. In past years these have included tennis and dance. Parent support for activities was confirmed last school year and we appreciate your contribution towards this opportunity.
Field Studies - To be determined throughout the school year at the classroom level	Throughout the school year your child's teacher may plan supplementary learning opportunities at locations outside of the school and request monies towards entrance fees, transportation or equipment rental. Your child's teacher will communicate this information to you directly.

You will be receiving a copy of the school fees for 2024-2025 in September.

Creative Writing Adventures (Grades 2-3) (Grades 4-7)



Students will be encouraged to:

- express themselves by building out detailed stories
- develop confidence in their writing abilities
- practice building out the plot line
- reinforce neat printing and positive writing habits


Creative Boardgamers (Grades 5-7)



Students will design, write, create and build out their very own board games. Students will be encouraged to:

- think creatively to plan, and construct a board game from start to finish
- gain writing practice (e.g. writing to explain the rules, to describe the game, and to persuade others to play)
- apply and reinforce collaborative learning and project based learning skills
- develop positive habits that will help them become strong writers and planners.

Ready to Go (Grades 6-7)



Students will learn about the growth mindset and gain skillsets that will boost their motivation to learn and set good habits. Students will learn to:

- construct attainable goals
- set up a planning system that will allow their goals to be met
- manage their time and find balance between work and play
- maintain their own schedules and keep track of their schoolwork
- Small tasks will be assigned weekly to encourage students to apply the skills taught to start reinforcing positive habits. Students will receive a workbook that includes session handouts, goal setting templates and time blocking schedulers.

The goal for these classes is to encourage children to enjoy learning and to build on skillsets to improve. All classes are interactive with a focus on developing the growth mindset.
