#### **GRADUATION ASSESSMENTS**

As part of British Columbia's graduation requirements, students are required to write three Graduation Assessments Numeracy10, Literacy10, and Literacy12. The assessment session for Literacy 12 is going to occur during the week of October 28, 2024 to November 1, 2024.

Students who are missing a Graduation Assessment(s), you may be scheduled to write the assessment(s) during this week as well.

Students will be excused from the classes that you regularly attend to write the assessment and students are expected to attend their regularly scheduled classes when they are not scheduled to write an assessment or if they complete your assessment before the provided end time.

<u>Further information is posted in the school foyer of the school about the Assessments</u> as well as links/QR codes that will take you to online information and <u>resources to prepare for the Assessment(s)</u>. Note that this is NOT a Provincial Exam. The result you achieve on the Assessment(s) will not impact your academic standing, BUT you are required to write the assessment to meet Graduation Requirements.

#### **ACTION ITEMS:**

- Verify that you have completed all your Graduation Assessments and if not confirm that you are scheduled to write your missing assessment.
- Make note of your assigned assessment date, time, and location. This can be found in the school foyer. If you need to write previous assessments, please look for your name on other days.
- Refer to the supporting Ministry of Education webpages to prepare for the assessment.
- Please see your Counsellor should you have questions regarding your graduation requirements.
- Please contact <u>Mr. Gock</u> should you have questions regarding writing your Graduation Assessment(s).

If your child receives an IE (Insufficient Evidence) for any of their classes, it is crucial that they connect with their teacher(s) to develop a plan to demonstrate their learning of the course material. Please note that all work must be submitted prior to the end of the semester to be assessed and evaluated for semester 1 *Summary of Learning* unless specified by the teacher. #### **VSB** Accounts

All students have an VSB account created with your username as [studentnumber]@learn.vsb.bc.ca For example, if your student number is 8675309, then your username is 8675309@learn.vsb.bc.ca This account will be used daily by students, so please be sure your child has their password and can login to use school computers, Office 365, VSB email and VSB Secured WiFi. If you need to reset your password, you can visit http://studentpass.vsb.bc.ca and choose a new password. Security guidelines suggest using two or three words such as "purple pumpkin pepper."

#### **COLLABORATIVE PLANNING TIME**

This year the Vancouver School Board calendar will include eight (8) days on which the school day is shortened for students. The school day remains the same length for school staff. These periods of time, called Collaboration Planning Time, provide the opportunity for school staff to come together to engage in activities and discussions specific to their unique school community to support and enhance student progress and achievement. During Collaboration Planning Time, teachers work directly with peers within the school setting to share, discuss, and learn from each other to enhance their teaching practice within the "Four Pillars" of education:

During Collaborative Planning Times, students are not expected to be at school. To ensure that instruction is equitable during all periods, some Collaborative Planning Times will be scheduled in the morning during the AM- 8:40 AM – 10:00 AM or the PM- 1:45 PM – 3:06 PM As a reminder, the Provincial government sets out minimum hours of instruction for all grade levels. The Vancouver School Board calendar, with Staff Collaboration Planning Time included, still meets all Provincial requirements.

## FLEXIBLE INSTRUCTIONAL TIME (FIT)

The purpose of Flexible Instructional Time is to provide students with time and flexibility to meet with teachers for support, guidance, and inspiration regarding curriculum or other passions and interests. Students are also able to collaborate with peers to explore, work on, or complete assignments and projects (curricular or extra-curricular).

#### **Expectations of Students During FIT**

Students are expected to be in a classroom or learning space, with a teacher or staff member during FIT. On **Tuesday** and **Thursday** FIT sessions, students *must* sign-up using <u>MyWeeklyPlanner</u>. Students should use the Thursday FIT session to sign-up for the upcoming week. Once signed up for a FIT session, students are expected to attend, and remain in the space they have selected. This is instructional time and we want to support students in taking ownership over their learning. On **Monday** and **Friday**, students who are in the building are expected to be in a learning space but there is no requirement to sign-up for Monday or Friday FIT sessions.
