COLLABORATIVE PLANNING TIME

This year the Vancouver School Board calendar will include eight (8) days on which the school day is shortened for students. The school day remains the same length for school staff. These periods of time, called Collaboration Planning Time, provide the opportunity for school staff to come together to engage in activities and discussions specific to their unique school community to support and enhance student progress and achievement. During Collaboration Planning Time, teachers work directly with peers within the school setting to share, discuss, and learn from each other to enhance their teaching practice within the "Four Pillars" of education:

Curriculum ♦ Instruction ♦ Assessment ♦ Social / Emotional Learning

During Collaborative Planning Times, students are not expected to be at school. To ensure that instruction is equitable during all periods, some Collaborative Planning Times will be scheduled in the morning during the AM- 8:40 AM - 10:00 AM or the PM- 1:45 PM - 3:06 PM As a reminder, the Provincial government sets out minimum hours of instruction for all grade levels. The Vancouver School Board calendar, with Staff Collaboration Planning Time included, still meets all Provincial requirements.

FLEXIBLE INSTRUCTIONAL TIME (FIT)

As the end of semester approaches, students should be making use of FIT sessions to complete assignments, finish any missed work, get extra support, and to prepare for final assessments or projects.

The purpose of Flexible Instructional Time is to provide students with time and flexibility to meet with teachers for support, guidance, and inspiration regarding curriculum or other passions and interests. Students are also able to collaborate with peers to explore, work on, or complete assignments and projects (curricular or extra-curricular).

Expectations of Students During FIT

Students are expected to be in a classroom or learning space, with a teacher or staff member during FIT. On **Tuesday** and **Thursday** FIT sessions, students *must* sign-up using <u>MyWeeklyPlanner</u>. Students should use the Thursday FIT session to sign-up for the upcoming week. Once signed up for a FIT session, students are expected to attend, and remain in the space they have selected. This is instructional time and we want to support students in taking ownership over their learning. On **Monday** and **Friday**, students who are in the building are expected to be in a learning space but there is no requirement to sign-up for Monday or Friday FIT sessions.

GENERAL PROCEDURES

Reporting an Absence

To report your child's absence, please email the school at tmplsafearrival@vsb.bc.ca Information required is:

- Date of absence
- Student number
- Student name (first and last name)
- Period(s) missed
- Reason for absence (i.e. sick, appointment, etc.)

Please note: Students cannot report their own absence.

Supporting Students to Arrive On-Time

Students are expected to arrive on-time for their classes, prepared and ready to learn. There is a place for families and caregivers to be involved in supporting students make it to school on-time below are some ways that families can help support students to arrive on-time:

Tips for Punctuality

- 1. Rethink the meaning of "on time." If classes start at 8:40, students should be seated in the classroom at 8:35.
- 2. Understand the importance of being on time the first 10 minutes of class are the most important
- 3. Get enough sleep
- 4. Give yourself a realistic amount of time to dress and groom
- 5. Communicate any problems. If your bus is always late or you have to take your little brother to school and it always makes you late, communicate this to your teacher
- 6. Follow traffic updates. If you depend on public transportation to get to school, always keep an eye on schedule interruptions
- 7. Have a backup plan for your transportation.
- 8. Set your clocks forward by ten minutes. This is a little psychological trick that really works!

WEATHER-RELATED SCHOOL CLOSURES

VSB has procedures in place for when severe weather, like heavy snowfall or extremely high winds, may affect schools. During severe weather events, all schools in the Vancouver School District will remain open, if possible. If a District-wide closure is necessary, that will be decided and publicized by 6:30 a.m.

District-wide school closures will be announced through the media, the <u>District website</u>, school websites and social media channels.

How are decisions made about school closures?

We monitor forecasts and conditions, and work with the City of Vancouver and other partners to assess safety when there may be:

- heavy snowfall
- extreme cold
- freezing rain
- extreme heat
- other hazardous weather/emergency conditions that pose risks to student and staff safety

We coordinate with neighbouring school districts to align our decisions where possible.

The decision to close schools is made in consideration of safety, equity and well-being.

We consider other impacts weather conditions may have, like transit delays, meal programs for students, other essential student supports and impacts to learning. If weather conditions begin or worsen during a school day, usually, schools will remain open until the end of the school day.

Except under extreme circumstances, all schools and offices will remain open, if possible. Typically, no announcement will be made that schools are open. Only cancellations, closures or delayed school openings will be announced.

Extra-curricular activities, school events and field trips may be cancelled because of weather – even when school remains open.

Remember to dress for the weather and take extra care when traveling between school and home. Drivers are reminded to slow down and remain alert in and around school zones.

What if I don't think it is safe for my child to go to school due to weather conditions?

Student safety is our top priority. If for any reason a parent/guardian feels that a child cannot travel safely to/from school, they can notify their child's schools about the expected absence. Students will not be penalized.
