## **GRADUATION ASSESSMENT INFORMATION**

Graduation assessments are used to assess students' proficiency in numeracy and literacy. Graduation assessments are not associated with any course mark, but their completion is part of the BC Graduation Requirements.

Students in Grade 10 have been scheduled to write the Literacy 10 Assessment between **April 14 through 17**. Families can familiarize themselves with assessment information, preassessment activities and assessment exemplars: <u>Practice and Information Link.</u>

Students who are missing a Graduation Assessment in grades 10-12 may also be scheduled to write a missing assessment(s) during this week as well.

The exact timing and schedule for individual students will be posted in the foyer in the weeks leading up to the assessment. The same information will also be shared with students via Microsoft Teams,

- Verify that you have completed all your Graduation Assessments and if not confirm that you are scheduled to write your missing assessment.
- Make note of your assigned assessment date, time, and location. This can be found in the school foyer. If you need to write previous assessments, please look for your name on other days.

## COLLABORATIVE PLANNING TIME

This year the Vancouver School Board calendar will include eight (8) days on which the school day is shortened for students. The school day remains the same length for school staff. These periods of time, called Collaboration Planning Time, provide the opportunity for school staff to come together to engage in activities and discussions specific to their unique school community to support and enhance student progress and achievement. During Collaboration Planning Time, teachers work directly with peers within the school setting to share, discuss, and learn from each other to enhance their teaching practice within the "Four Pillars" of education:

Curriculum ♦ Instruction ♦ Assessment ♦ Social / Emotional Learning

During Collaborative Planning Times, students are not expected to be at school. To ensure that instruction is equitable during all periods, some Collaborative Planning Times will be scheduled in the morning during the AM- 8:40 AM – 10:00 AM or the PM- 1:45 PM – 3:06 PM As a reminder, the Provincial government sets out minimum hours of instruction for all grade levels. The Vancouver School Board calendar, with Staff Collaboration Planning Time included, still meets all Provincial requirements.

# FLEXIBLE INSTRUCTIONAL TIME (FIT)

Semester 2 is well underway and students should continue to make use of FIT sessions to complete assignments, finish any missed work, get extra support, and prepare for mid-semester assessments or projects.

The purpose of Flexible Instructional Time is to provide students with time and flexibility to meet with teachers for support, guidance, and inspiration regarding curriculum or other passions and interests. Students are also able to collaborate with peers to explore, work on, or complete assignments and projects (curricular or extra-curricular).

## **Expectations of Students During FIT**

Students are expected to be in a classroom or learning space, with a teacher or staff member during FIT. On **Tuesday** and **Thursday** FIT sessions, students *must* sign-up using <u>MyWeeklyPlanner</u>. Students should use the Thursday FIT session to sign-up for the upcoming week. Once signed up for a FIT session, students are expected to attend, and remain in the space they have selected. This is instructional time and we want to support students in taking ownership over their learning. On **Monday** and **Friday**, students who are in the building are expected to be in a learning space but there is no requirement to sign-up for Monday or Friday FIT sessions.

## PROVINCIAL STUDENT LEARNING SURVEY

The Provincial Student Learning Survey is unique in its scope, size and usefulness to schools. It gathers information from parents/guardians/caregivers, teachers, and students on topics related to school environment, safety, and achievement. The information is used for planning in individual schools and provides a district and provincial perspective. In April 2025 the Student Learning Survey will be distributed to students in all grades during FIT. Parents/guardians/caregivers, and all school staff also have an opportunity to complete this survey. We encourage parents/guardians/caregivers to participate in this survey, as the results are important in identifying and celebrating current strengths, as well as determining where the school needs to focus improvement. Students who are not able to complete this survey at school, can be supported at home to ensure their voice is heard.

The surveys contain standard questions for the Province – in addition, questions from the school and/or district that focus on local conditions or issues may be included. The survey can be completed electronically and can be accessed on the Internet at <a href="https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/education-training/k-12/support/student-learning-survey">https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/education-training/k-12/support/student-learning-survey</a>

Any computer or mobile device with an Internet connection can be used, and access to the e-survey is simple and secure. The survey can be accessed through the link and by clicking on Take the Survey. On the login page, click on the Parents icon, and then select the school district and school name where your child attends school. Provincial, District and School Reports for previous years can be viewed at the same site under the Results section.

The e-survey site will be open until May 2, 2025.

#### Reporting an Absence

- Period(s) missed
- Reason for absence (i.e. sick, appointment, etc.)

## **Supporting Students to Arrive On-Time**

Students are expected to arrive on-time for their classes, prepared and ready to learn. There is a place for families and caregivers to be involved in supporting students make it to school on-time below are some ways that families can help support students to arrive on-time:

#### **Tips for Punctuality**

- 1. Rethink the meaning of "on time." If classes start at 8:40, students should be seated in the classroom at 8:35.
- 2. Understand the importance of being on time the first 10 minutes of class are the most important
- 3. Get enough sleep
- 4. Give yourself a realistic amount of time to dress and groom
- 5. Communicate any problems. If your bus is always late or you have to take your little brother to school and it always makes you late, communicate this to your teacher
- 6. Follow traffic updates. If you depend on public transportation to get to school, always keep an eye on schedule interruptions
- 7. Have a backup plan for your transportation.
- 8. Set your clocks forward by ten minutes. This is a little psychological trick that really works!
