VSB Accounts

All students have an VSB account created with your username as [studentnumber]@learn.vsb.bc.ca For example, if your student number is 8675309, then your username is 8675309@learn.vsb.bc.ca This account will be used daily by students, so please be sure your child has their password and can login to use school computers, Office 365, VSB email and VSB Secured WiFi. If you need to reset your password, you can visit http://studentpass.vsb.bc.ca and choose a new password. Security guidelines suggest using two or three words such as "purple pumpkin pepper."

Microsoft Teams

We will continue the use of MS Teams this year, with students being added to classroom and school/grade-wide Teams this week. All students have been added to the Templeton All Student Team, which will be the central hub for school communication. Many classes will use TEAMS to post course information, assignments and other class happenings. Starting next week, students should be checking Teams as part of their daily routine. We encourage families to access TEAMS with their child to see what it entails.

COLLABORATIVE PLANNING TIME

This year the Vancouver School Board calendar will include eight (8) days on which the school day is shortened for students. The school day remains the same length for school staff. These periods of time, called Collaboration Planning Time, provide the opportunity for school staff to come together to engage in activities and discussions specific to their unique school community to support and enhance student progress and achievement. During Collaboration Planning Time, teachers work directly with peers within the school setting to share, discuss, and learn from each other to enhance their teaching practice within the "Four Pillars" of education:

Curriculum ◆ Instruction ◆ Assessment ◆ Social / Emotional Learning.

During Collaborative Planning Times, students are not expected to be at school. To ensure that instruction is equitable during all periods, some Collaborative Planning Times will be scheduled in the morning during the AM- 8:40 AM - 10:00 AM or the PM- 1:45 PM - 3:05 PM As a reminder, the Provincial government sets out minimum hours of instruction for all grade levels. The Vancouver School Board calendar, with Staff Collaboration Planning Time included, still meets all Provincial requirements.

FLEXIBLE INSTRUCTIONAL TIME (FIT)

The purpose of Flexible Instructional Time is to provide students with time and flexibility to meet with teachers for support, guidance, and inspiration regarding curriculum or other passions and interests. Students are also able to collaborate with peers to explore, work on, or complete assignments and projects (curricular or extra-curricular).

Expectations of Students During FIT

Students are expected to be in a classroom or learning space, with a teacher or staff member during FIT. On **Tuesday** and **Thursday** FIT sessions, students *must* sign-up using <u>FIT Planner</u>. Students should use the Thursday FIT session to sign-up for the upcoming week. Once signed up for a FIT session, students are expected to attend, and remain in the space they have selected. This is instructional time and we want to support students in taking ownership over their learning. On **Monday** and **Friday**, students who are in the building are expected to be in a learning space but there is no requirement to sign-up for Monday or Friday FIT sessions.

FIT Will begin on September 18, 2025 – until this date, the daily bell schedule will follow a "Wednesday" schedule (see below).

LEARNING UPDATES (STUDENT REPORTING)

The purpose of assessment is to facilitate learning and move it forward in an equitable and inclusive way. It helps students answer three questions about their learning:

- Where am I now?
- Where am I going?
- How do I get there?

Quality assessment is ongoing and responsive. It informs the instruction cycle and provides teachers with evidence to plan. It helps families understand and support their children's learning. Most importantly, it provides students with meaningful feedback to guide their learning and help them reflect on their growth.

The new Provincial Reporting Policy requires that students in Grades 8 and 9 will receive marks on a four-point proficiency scale (Emerging, Developing, Proficient, Extending), while students in Grades 10-12 will still receive a letter grade and percentage. Learning Updates (report cards) for all students will now also include self-reflection and goal setting, as well as descriptive feedback.

GRADUATION ASSESSMENTS

Graduation assessments are not associated with any course mark, but their completion is part of the BC Graduation Requirements.

Students in Grade 10 will be scheduled to write two Provincial Assessments to assess their proficiency in numeracy and literacy. Any student in grade 11 or 12 who has not written the numeracy or literacy 10 assessments will also be scheduled to write during this assessment window.

Students that are in Grade 12 will be scheduled to write the literacy assessment. Details of times and room numbers will be provided closer to the date. Practice assessments and answer keys can be found <u>HERE</u>.
