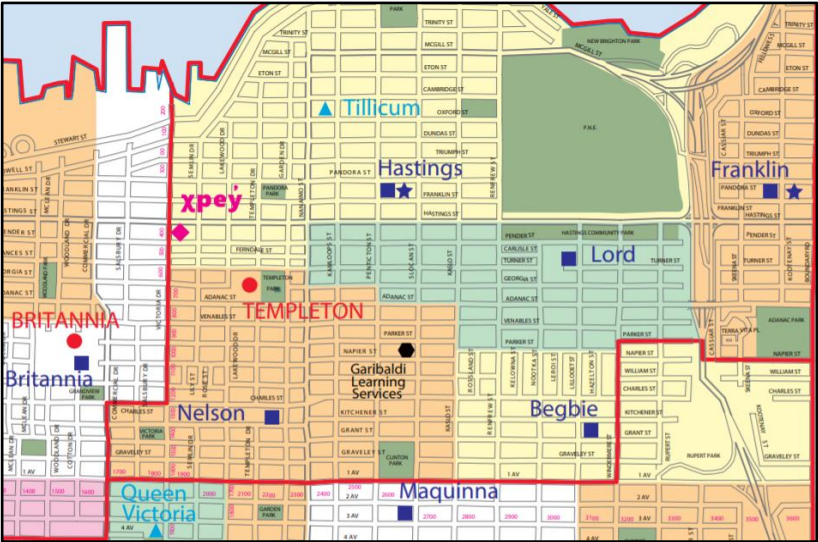

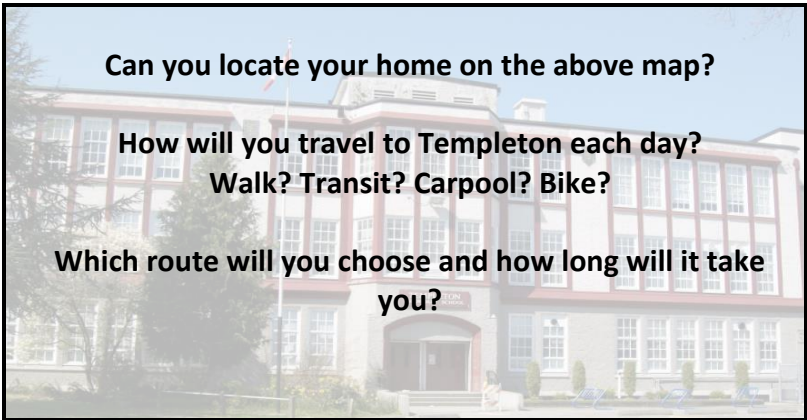

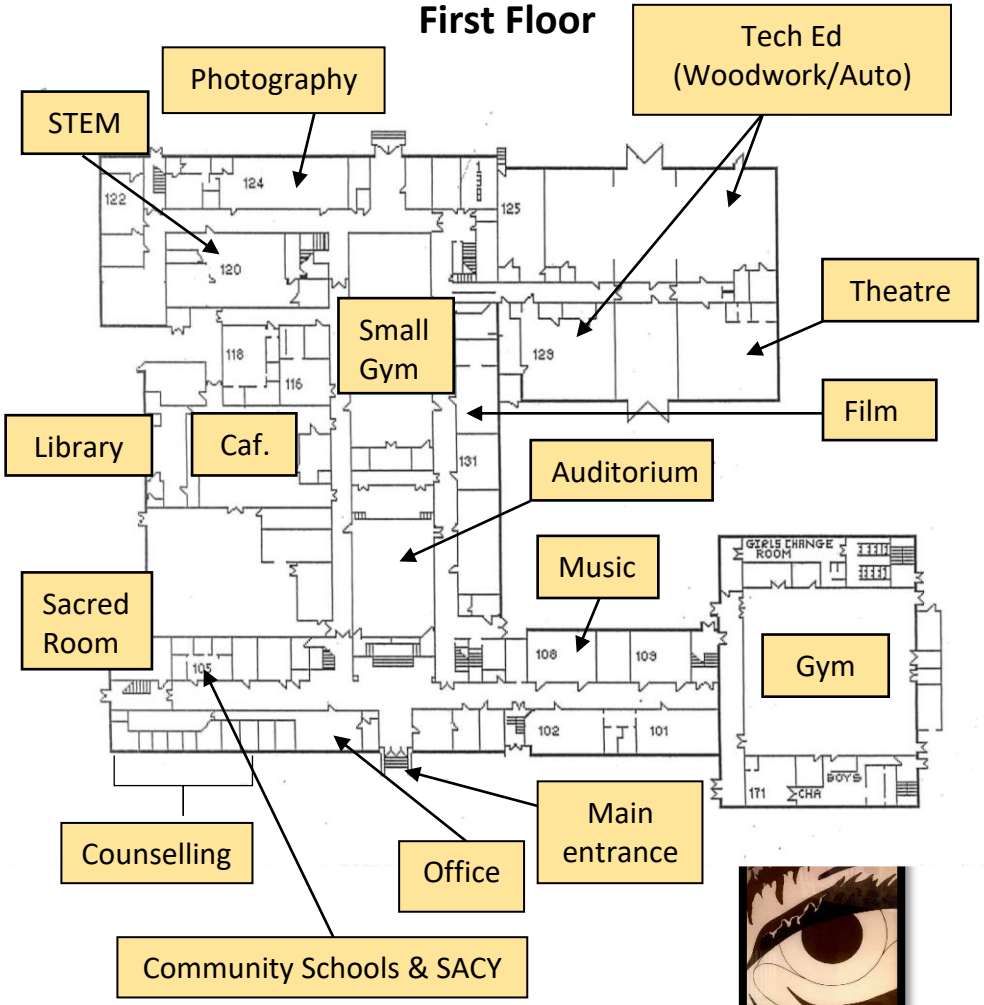

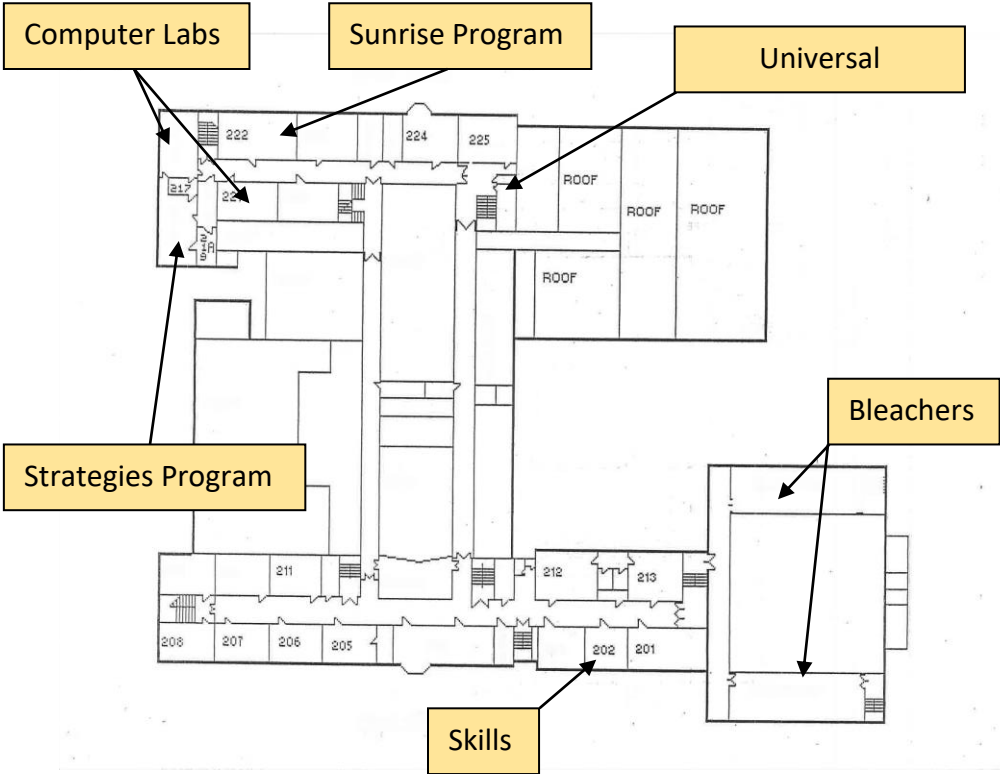
Templeton – Floorplan

First Floor



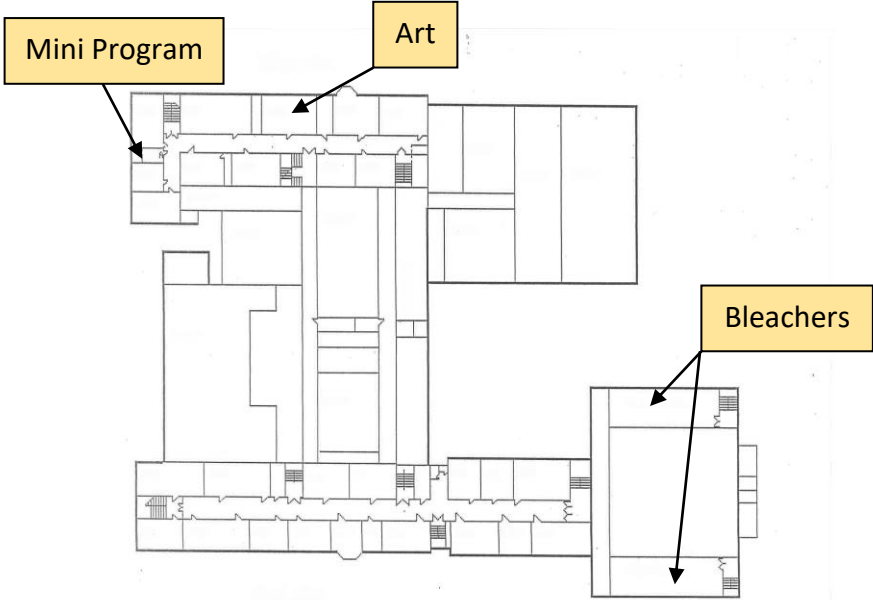
Templeton – Floorplan

Entrance

Typically, students enter the school from the main entrance and then enter the foyer. It's the main intersection of *Titan Town* where students can branch off in any direction. Here, we feature student artwork and it's often the place where student-led activities like fundraising or celebrations happen (i.e. Pink Shirt Day).

Office

The office is where much of the business of the school happens. You may need to come here to pay school fees, obtain student information like your schedule, receive medical attention or report a lost item. Being patient and courteous will be helpful when visiting the office as there's often lots going on.

Counselling

Down the hall from the main office, you'll find a number of mini-offices, our Chinese and Vietnamese Multi-Cultural Workers and grade counselors. Counselling staff are available to support your success in and out of school and can help with your academic achievement, mental wellness, post-secondary decision making and navigating your educational path at Templeton. We also receive support from a school Doctor and VCH Community Nurse on a part-time basis.

Sacred Room

The Sacred Room is a school space where indigenous cultural activities and student support are offered in addition to other activities. Our Aboriginal Education Enhancement Teacher and Worker can be found in this space on a part-time basis. All students are welcome here.

Community Schools Office

The Community Schools office is a place to learn about in-school and community volunteering opportunities, do homework, meet with other students, grab a free snack or connect with a staff, Community Schools Coordinator or Youth and Family Worker. The SACY (Supporting and Connecting Youth) is also here, and their Youth Prevention Worker has part-time hours to assist you with wellness promotion and substance misuse education. If the Community Schools office door is open, please come in!

Library

Our Library houses a great collection of reference materials, magazines, fiction and non-fiction books, computers and printing services. There's also cozy reading and study areas and a "maker space" to provide the tools and materials to inspire your creativity when tackling your school projects and assignments. Also, our librarian provides your wi-fi login and password and is a great resource. Ask our librarian about the Templeton and VPL Library Clubs.

Cafeteria

Our school cafeteria provides nutritious and delicious snacks and meals (for both Templeton and many elementary schools) with menu features changing daily. Students can also eat their own lunch here with friends and are able to use the microwaves to reheat what they bring. Inside the cafeteria, we also have a student-run school store, TEMP-Mart, where you can purchase snacks, goodies and always-in-fashion Titan swag.

Auditorium

Our Auditorium is a place you may come to for grade assemblies, guest speakers, music performances, Film Club and special events like a movie night. We have upgraded

our technology and now have state-of-the-art sound, light and projection systems.

Small Gym

The small gym is one of two hardwood floor spaces for sports training, physical health classes, and team practices. We can set this space up for archery too!

S.T.E.M.

Templeton has a STEM program which integrates Science, Technology, Engineering and Math through project and inquiry-based learning. You may see STEM students building stair climbing robots, launching rockets on the field or hard at work in the STEM lab. The Chess Club also meets here.

Technical Education

Templeton has fantastic facilities in the technical education department in the fields of woodworking, auto mechanics, and electronics. The hands-on learning skills you develop here can be used throughout your life and may be a stepping stone to a career in trades.

Theatre & Film

Our Templeton theatre and Film programs (aka *Dream Big Productions*) is the pride of Templeton. Professional quality productions are created by students, staff and visiting industry professionals, some of them Templeton graduates. Our talented students perform classic productions and create their own films and plays. Learn about acting, writing, directing, lighting and sound, and more.

Big Gym

Here's where physical health classes happen, and Titans compete. Beside the gym, we have a fitness room where students can learn the basics of weight training, exercise

programs and after school drop-in sessions. If you're not competing, come to the bleachers to cheer on our teams!

Art/Photography

Templeton students are expressive, creative, and innovative. Templeton's art and photography program provides opportunities for our students to create exceptional works through the mediums of photography, pottery, sculpture, drawing and painting, and more. We have our own dark room and pottery kiln; both rare and valuable facilities in Vancouver schools.

Home Economics

In our home economics programs, students can learn valuable and practical skills in areas such as cooking, textiles, and nutrition. Develop skills here to use at home or in the food services, health or fashion industries.

Music Room

Our music programs provide an opportunity for students like you to develop music appreciation, technical instrumentation skills and to be a part of a creative and supportive community. We have a fantastic collection of acoustic and electric instruments, recording equipment and practice spaces. Come find your groove!

Outside and nearby the school

Our school is fortunate to be on the Adanac bike path in the heart of the Hastings-Sunrise neighborhood. We have Templeton Pool only steps away and our school site sits between our school field and Templeton Park which includes a grass field and running track. In addition, we have our own outdoor tennis courts, basketball court and school garden. Join the Garden Club!

Top 10 Frequently Asked Questions

1. Is grade 8 hard?

Any big life change can be challenging and grade 8 is no exception. Give yourself some time to get used to routines, find your way around, and let all the new information settle in. You're not going thru this challenge alone and there are many staff here to support your success. If you're struggling, let someone know. We've got you.

2. How much homework will I get?

Just like in elementary school, the amount you get assigned can vary by teacher and subject. Use F.I.T. wisely and try to set aside time in your day to review, catch up or stay organized. Larger assignments, group projects and preparation for tests will increase the time needed for home study. Support is available through the resource center.

3. Is it hard to make friends?

The best way to make friends at Templeton is to be yourself, be open, and get involved in school activities. Good people, just like you, are found here!

4. What if I get lost?

Don't panic! You can ask anyone for directions or look for "You Are Here" maps found around the school. After a short time, you will confidently know where (almost) everything is.

5. How many grade 8s are there?

You are one of about 200 grade 8s at Templeton for the 2024-25 school year. Templeton's overall population is currently over 900 students.

6. What about lockers?

School lockers are available for all grades and a lock can be purchased at the school office. Grade 8 lockers are situated near the main office, counselling, the Community Schools office and Sacred Room.

7. What sports and clubs can I join?

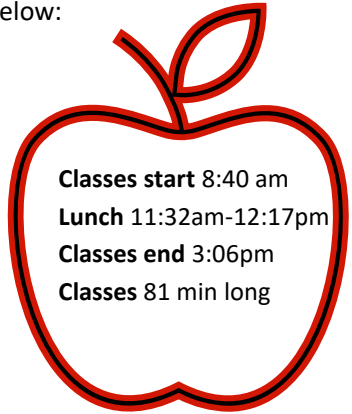
