This week, <u>SPEC</u> (Society Providing Conservation Education) led garden lessons to Thunderbird students. SPEC has been a valued partner with our school community for the past 8 years! We are grateful for their time and expertise they share with our community.

Next week, we will participate in an earthquake drill, the Great British Columbia ShakeOut. The Great British Columbia ShakeOut is an annual opportunity to practice how to be safer during big earthquakes: "Drop, Cover, and Hold On." We used this time to prepare, review, and update our emergency preparedness plans and take stock of our supplies to best respond to a seismic event. Thank you to our PAC for helping us fund a student emergency care kit, meant to provide activities for students if we were not able to occupy the building for an extended time period.

Our Parent Teacher CSL Conferences (Communicating Student Learning) will be held on October 25 and October 26, starting at 2:00 pm. These days will be early dismissal days for children. For the conferences, there will be an option for **In-Person** or **Virtual TEAMs Meetings** through our online booking page here. There will be an option to request a translator, if needed. Booking is now open. Please contact your teacher with any questions, or if you are unable to make these dates.

As Halloween is fast approaching, students and families are beginning to plan their costumes for our annual Halloween parade on October 31, please remember it is meant to be fun and exciting, however, some costume choices run the risk of offending others with costumes that are culturally offensive. It is important not to inadvertently mimic culture by culturally appropriating racial or ethnic groups or wear costumes that promote or normalize violence. Costumes should not include weapons and other props of violence. Thank you in advance for your cooperation in choosing a school appropriate costume.

In anticipation of the City of Vancouver's new draft plan for the Rupert and Renfrew Station Area, they are hosting a series of events to highlight Still Creek and the central role it will play in the plan. From flood protection to habitat and ecology, Still Creek, will be key to the future of the neighbourhood. The Still Creek, is a new technical study that will guide future work in Still Creek including creek widening and daylighting! The City wants to celebrate this unique neighbourhood amenity with the community, and give everyone a chance to learn more about the creek and update about the community art project with a festival.

Still Creek Festival will be held Saturday, November 4th from 1:00 – 4:00 pm. It will be in the northeast corner of the Grandview Superstore parking lot at 3185 Grandview Highway, beside a daylit portion of Still Creek and the original Fish on Fences Still Creek Mural, that was completed in 2004 when the City released its first Still Creek Enhancement Study. Stream of Dreams will be at the event, leading activities to paint new wooden fish to update the existing mural, Still Moon Arts will be leading needle felting activities, including the chance to add to their Community Vision Quilt, a needle-felted way to contribute your ideas for the future of the community, tours of the Beaver Pond(er)ing Lodging sculpture and the chance to try some wearable bird puppets. Chris Hamilton will provide children's entertainment, and there will be face-painting and other child-friendly activities. The event is designed for all ages to have some fun, learn about the future of Still Creek and the upcoming Rupert and Renfrew Station Area Plan. Please see the attached flyers.
