P. Jamshidian's Items P. Jamshidian asked what sort of resources PAC can provide if/when parents encounter school-related issues. J. Iverson said the current PAC Executive is thinly resourced and does not currently have capacity. B. Toews said PACs tend to advocate for the school community, not individual members. J. Iverson said the DPAC (District Parents' Advisory Councils) might have suggestions for advocacy resources. B. Toews said the schoolboard has resources.

P. Jamshidian asked about supervision on the soccer field during the lunchbreak. She said she is aware of numerous fights. B. Toews said he will speak to the school's supervision aids. There are three adults on the playground at any given time. He could not confirm the number of fights but acknowledged fights do happen and they are dealt with on a case-by-case basis. P. Jamshidian suggested 1. setting up a program for parent volunteers to monitor the soccer field; and 2. asking for more staff supervision.
