 - O Div. 2 taught words in handaminam (hunk-a-mean-um). Coast Salish people speak dialects of a family of languages called handaminam (hunk-a-mean-um). These languages are spoken from Vancouver Island to as far east as where the town of Hope is situated.

Fundraising Initiatives

Members discussed *why* the PAC fundraises. As examples, shirt sales provide families with low-cost Spirit Wear, and bottle drives are environmental lessons. Given the PAC's limited resources, members said the *why* is important when deciding which initiatives to support.

Members decided against a Purdys fundraiser this year, in part because there is nobody to organize it, and in part because folks want to pursue new opportunities.

J. Iverson said the orange and pink Thunderbird shirts have arrived and the PAC has already sold 22. At \$10/shirt, the margin is very small (approx. \$2). Members agreed to keep the cost low. The next step is marketing the shirts, including setting up a display in the school foyer and circulating a flyer with details.
