FINANCIAL HARDSHIP POLICY

The District is committed to ensuring that no school-age student will be denied an opportunity to participate in a course, class or program because of an inability to pay fees.

Procedures

- 1. The District recognizes that some families may not be able to afford school fees. No student of school age will be denied an opportunity to participate in a course, class or program because of financial hardship.
- 2. Applications 2.1. Parents unable to pay some or all of a school fee are invited to speak to their child's teacher, school counsellor, and/or the Principal.
- 3. Confidentiality 3.1. All financial hardship applications and discussions shall be confidential, with a view to facilitating the student's participation.
- 4. Actions 4.1. Actions that may be taken to address barriers to participation include partial payment or complete waiver of the fee, payment by installment, and/or fundraising activities to reduce overall costs.

Rights: At Moberly, each person has the right to be treated with dignity




Crazy Chemistry (Division 6, 7, 10, 11, 13)


