

# VCH When Should I Keep My Sick Child Home from School

## Things to consider if your child feels unwell:

- The wellbeing of your child. Without proper rest, a child may have a hard time fighting illness or be at risk for other illnesses.
- The ability of your child to actively take part and learn at school.
- The school staff cannot care for a sick child and give them the support that they may need.
- The protection of other children

# Please keep your child home if they:

- Have a fever.
- Are too sick to take part in normal school activities.
- Have a suspected or known communicable disease (i.e., strep throat, chicken pox, measles).
- Is vomiting or has diarrhea. It is recommended that students be symptom free at least 24 hours before returning to school.

# Keep your child home until they can participate fully in normal school activities or as told by a health care provider.

Please let the school know your child's symptoms as per the school's callback procedures.

If the school finds it necessary to send your child home because of illness, please make sure you have arranged an emergency contact if you're not available. Inform your school of these arrangements.

# New Government Reporting Order for 2023/2024

#### Not Report Cards but rather Learning Updates

- 1) The Purpose of Assessment to facilitate learning and move it forward in an equitable way. It should help to answer the questions: Where am I now? Where am I going? How do I get there?
- 2) We are guided by the same ideas found in the First People's Principles of Learning Learning is holistic, reflexive, reflective, experiential, and relational. Learning involves generational roles and responsibilities.
- 3) The Provincial Proficiency scale (Now reduced to only 4 areas!)

\*Everyone has a place on the scale but Proficient is the goal for all students.

- 4) How we Assess Learning is continuous. Averaging marks over a term, semester, or year does not provide an accurate picture of student learning. Learning demonstrated close to the communication of student learning will be the most reflective of student proficiency and should be used as the strongest evidence of learning when deciding on a letter grade and percentage. Assessment should be based on the learning standards alone. Attendance and behavior should not factor into where students land on the proficiency scale.
- 5) New Possible Mark "IE" Insufficient Evidence of learning is only used when a student arrives late in the term or is away for an extended period.
- 6) The Timeline Teachers will provide feedback on each subject taught in 3 written reports that will be sent home and there will also be 2 in-person conferences offered. For conferences, teachers may decide to conduct goal setting conferences, student-led conferences, or parent teacher conferences. All students will create goals for the year and complete Core Competency Self Assessments three times per year.



## Ms. Wong's Division 11 class is hosting the Roots of Empathy baby this year...

BC was one of the first provinces to embrace Roots of Empathy programs for elementary school children and BC co-piloted the Seeds of Empathy program for children 3-5 years old in childcare centres.



BC was one of the first regions to do research on Roots of Empathy. Dr. Kimberly Schonert-Reichl of the University of British Columbia and Director of the Human Early Learning Partnership measured the efficacy of Roots of Empathy as a social emotional learning (SEL) program and found that teachers considered students in Roots of Empathy classrooms to be less aggressive and that students were more likely to say their peers exhibited pro social behaviors.
