Thursday May 5th is the VSB's annual district-wide Earthquake Drill. Students and staff will be practicing the Duck-Cover-Hold On process as well as how to evacuate the school and what to do afterwards in the event of an earthquake.

Aren't all drills the same? Actually, all emergency drills we practice are different. One way an earthquake drill is different from a fire drill is that students are given some time to gather all their personal belongings before leaving the school.

Practicing emergency drills increases student confidence, knowledge and execution of emergency response actions and allows us to identify any weaknesses in our current emergency system.
