School Wide Code of Conduct Celebrations

Livingstone students have been showcasing their learning about how we interact in our school community by taking part in school wide challenges. We wanted a fun, inclusive and meaningful way to celebrate our school's code of conduct, "Be Kind, Be Safe and Be Responsible". As a staff team each of us acknowledge positive student behaviour each day by handing out ROAR tickets to individual students.



Safety

In the Fall we kicked off our year by asking students to demonstrate their safe calm behaviour in the school's hallways and stairwells. We challenged them to earn 100 ROAR tickets as a whole school community. When Livingstone students reached this goal we all celebrated with an extra 20-minute recess in the afternoon. Our whole school, staff and students went outside to play together and it was fabulous!

Kindness

Our next challenge was sharing acts of kindness throughout our school. Students are challenged to earn 100 ROAR tickets as a school, in recognition of their acts of kindness by staff members. To celebrate this wonderful achievement, we will be celebrating with two in school dance parties during the day, one for primary students and another for intermediate students in February. In classrooms students will focus on how kindness is intentional, and at times might require thoughtful compromise and isn't always their first instinct. However, we are always reminding students that our ideal world is one where everyone belongs and we value problem solving conversations with each other. We recognize that mistakes will happen, but it is what we do to learn from mistakes and repair relationships that is important. As a staff team we know these are important daily conversations in our school. We work as a team to support our students skill development in conflict resolution, self-advocacy and knowledge of how emotions impact our ability to peacefully engage with others.

Basketball

Basketball season has just started last week. At Livingstone we are working to offer gender inclusive sports teams and have explained to students that both senior basketball teams are open to all grade 6/7 students. We have one team enrolled in the Senior Girls Plus league sponsored by coached by our support staff member Wendy Sam. Our second team is enrolled in the Senior Boys Plus league coached by Ms. Vieira and Ms. Wendy Sam. Finally, our third team is a Junior Boys plus team that is sponsored by Ms. Alexis Stanton and by parent volunteers "Amie Dmytryshyn, Kristin Houghton, Dave MacEntee, and Terence Gilhuly.

Cross Boundary Application

How to Apply Cross Boundary:

If you would like to apply to another school outside of your catchment:

Students in the Vancouver School District are allowed to register at a school outside of their catchment area as a cross boundary applicant. Cross boundary applications will only be considered after all in-catchment students have been accommodated.

<u>Step 1:</u> You MUST register at your <u>English Catchment School</u> BEFORE submitting a cross boundary application.

Step 2:

Complete an online Cross Boundary Application form

IMPORTANT DATES	OPENS	CLOSES
CROSS BOUNDARY APPLICATION PERIOD No late or early applications will be accepted	First school day of February	Last school day of February

Priority categories for cross boundary applicants are:

- **1st:** Non-catchment student with a sibling concurrently attending the same program **has a sibling that** will be concurrently attending the same location, in the same program.
- **2nd**: **Non-catchment student** (Daycare) A student resident in the School District enrolled in child care within the catchment (applies to Kindergarten Grade 7 only)
- 3rd: Non-catchment student A student that is a resident within the District
- 4th: Non-District student A British Columbian resident who does not reside in the Vancouver School District

Please note that the online Cross-Boundary Application form is for English program cross-boundary applications only. French Immersion cross-boundary applications are submitted directly to French Immersion school offices.

If you have questions, we encourage you to contact your catchment school principal.
