

ATTENDANCE AUDIT



This term we are reviewing student attendance to this point of the year and tracking student late arrivals. We will be contacting families whose children are chronically absent- ie. absent for more than 20 days in the school year and whose children arrive consistently late to school.

We know that there are times such as sickness and family events that are unavoidable, and we do take these reasons for absence into account. **However, attending school is important.** When children attend school consistently, they build stronger relationships with their teacher and classmates. Students feel a greater sense of belonging at school and are, therefore, more engaged and excited about learning. It is difficult to "catch children up" when they miss a significant amount of teacher instruction because of absence. When students enter class late, it is disruptive to the rest of the class, they have missed important information about the format of the day and quality learning time.

Research shows that 18 school days missed in one year can lead to one grade level of learning lost and students who miss this much school are less likely to graduate High School in Grade 12. To put it another way, if your child misses 1 day of school every two weeks, then by the time they get to grade 10, they will have missed a full year of school- it really adds up. Students should attend school every day unless there is an unavoidable reason.

EARTHQUAKE DRILL- THURSDAY 8TH MAY



Protect yourself during an Earthquake!



At 2:00pm, on Thursday 8th May, the school will be participating in the Vancouver School District's earthquake drill. Staff will be conducting a full evacuation onto the field and setting up the earthquake equipment as they would in the event of an earthquake. This year we will be releasing Kindergarten students from Kindergarten- Divisions 19, 20, 21 to parents at 2:15pm. We are going through this small-scale process of reunification so that as a school we can practice what we need to do and also to prepare parents for what the process will look like for them. We ask that only the families of students in Kindergarten come to school to collect their child at 2:15pm and follow the process below. All other students will be dismissed at the usual time of 2:58pm.

In the event that there needs to be a whole school evacuation this will be the process when collecting a child. You will be directed to:

- Go to the yellow sign marked 1- check-in gate (undercover area at front of school)
- Show your ID to an adult at the check- in gate and sign
- Take the yellow slip to Release gate 2 and hand to a member of staff
- Someone will go to where your child's class is waiting and collect your child
- Your child/ children will be brought over to you at release gate 2.

In the event of an emergency such as an earthquake where students have to be released to an adult, the school's priority at all times is the safety and well- being of the child. We will not release a student into the care of a relative, friend or neighbor who is not on the emergency contact list- the yellow sheet that was completed earlier this school year. I'm sure you understand that making sure we get all children into the care of the right adult will take time and we appreciate your patience while we do this. You will be required to show a piece of identification-even if you are a parent. This is because it may not be your child's teacher or a member of staff who knows you who is handing your child to you.

Just so you know, if there were to be a major earthquake children will be supervised by school staff for 72 hours before being placed in the care of the Ministry if they have not been collected. This will initially be onsite at Jamieson Elementary and then we would relocate to Churchill High School. Please take the time to develop a family emergency plan or to review your existing plan. SAFE ARRIVAL & STUDENT SIGN IN/OUT PROCEDURE

The Vancouver School Board has a safe arrival protocol district wide. If your child will be absent or late from school, please phone the school to report this absence as early as possible. Parents should leave a message on the dedicated answering service by calling 604-713-5367 and when prompted enter school code 1, prior to 9 am on the first day of the absence. Upon calling the Safe Arrival/Absence reporting phone line, you will be asked to leave a message and will require the following information:

- First & last name of your child (please spell the last name)
- Grade
- Division
- Reason for absence
- Date & length of absence

Late students:

If your child is late to school (arriving past 9am), they will need to be signed in on the student sign-in sheets on the table located near the cupboard of trophies.

Student Sign-Out Procedure:


