MESSAGE



Dear Families

I hope that you have all enjoyed our return to school. Happy Lunar New Year to our families who are celebrating the start of the Year of the Snake. Yesterday, we enjoyed a Lion Dance performance from the Hon Hsing Athletic Club.

In our assembly at the start of term, we talked about goal setting and having a growth mind set. We discussed breaking goals down into smaller parts, celebrating each achievement no matter how big or small and telling ourselves that if we can't do something, we say, "I can't do it, yet," and understanding that learning is a process. We watched this video Growth Mindset For Kids-Growth Mindset vs. Fixed Mindset-The Power Of Yet-Elementary-Middle School.

February is Black History month. Jamieson is celebrating Black History month by using age - appropriate resources and curriculum materials that raise awareness of the achievements and contributions of Black people to Canadian society past and present and which challenge stereotypes and racism. This work is not limited to one month though. A diverse and inclusive school creates a space for cultural exchange and has a positive impact upon everyone. All students should see themselves and their families reflected in the resources that we use, should hear positive stories about their identity and should feel safe to be themselves and to share their cultural background and experiences. Ensuring that all students have these rights is integral to student success at school. If you would like some starting points for family discussions, Sankofa read aloud has a lot of stories.

Pink Shirt Day will be on Wednesday 26th February - a day that celebrates students taking a stand against homophobic bullying. Sadly, school staff have heard an increase in the use of homophobic language in the school

recently. Students from grades 1-7 have been using language such as, "Last one it is gay," and That's so gay." Most of the children do not understand what they are saying, but older students do understand. We know that language matters and that words can hurt. Jamieson encompasses a large, diverse community, and our members include people who identify as Two Spirited, Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer (2SLGBTQ) and who have family and friends who identify as 2SLGBTQ. When we hear these slurs in school, they cause harm- to individuals and the community.

The use of homophobic language is very serious; it not only goes against our school Code of Conduct, but also the BC Human Rights Code. Regardless of our personal beliefs there is no place in our school or society for derogatory or discriminatory language. Jamieson is committed to being a safe and inclusive place for all members of our community. We know that students thrive socially and academically in schools that are safe, inclusive and welcoming to all. We appreciate your support in reinforcing the message that it is not OK to use these words.

Thank you to PAC for the funding of the iPads for the library. The cart has arrived, and the iPads are being configured by the I. T. Department- we hope to have them in use in the next couple of weeks. We have also booked the Bollywood dance workshops with Karima Essa for the first week of March. There will not be a performance for parents, but a whole school celebratory dance on the Friday afternoon.



SAFE ARRIVAL & STUDENT SIGN IN/OUT PROCEDURE

The Vancouver School Board has a safe arrival protocol district wide. If your child will be absent or late from school, please phone the school to report this absence as early as possible. Parents should leave a message on the dedicated answering service by calling 604-713-5367 and when prompted enter school code 1, prior to 9 am on the first day of the absence. Upon calling the Safe Arrival/Absence reporting phone line, you will be asked to leave a message and will require the following information:

- First & last name of your child (please spell the last name)
- Grade
- Division
- Reason for absence
- Date & length of absence

Late students:

If your child is late to school (arriving past 9am), they will need to be signed in on the student sign-in sheets on the table located near the cupboard of trophies.

Student Sign-Out Procedure:

When you pick up your child during the school day, please visit or call the office upon arrival at the school. The office staff will then ask you to complete the student sign out sheet. If your child returns throughout the day, please follow the same procedure to sign them back in.

LUNCHES AND UTENSILS

We kindly ask for your cooperation in ensuring that your child's lunch is packed in their backpack before school.

If you plan to drop off lunch for your child, we request that you communicate this with them beforehand. Please label the lunch with your child's name and division and leave it on the bench across from the office. Additionally, we encourage the use of eco-friendly utensils with the lunches. Please ensure your child has the utensils that they need to eat their lunch. We have a very limited supply at school that has run out recently.
