As we welcome October, I would like to thank you for a smooth and positive start to the school year. September was a busy and exciting time as students settled into their classrooms, formed new friendships, and embraced learning. MESSAGE FROM THE LIBRARY

Ms. Lee would like to thank the team of 45 library monitors who will be assisting her before and after school starting this week. We are also accepting donations of gently used books to add to the school library. Finally, library book bags are available for purchase costing \$15. Let your child's teacher know if you are interested in buying a library book bag and you will be directly invoiced through cash online.

The library is open to students and parents for quiet reading and book exchange until 3:15pm every day.



FEES AND FUNDING

As I shared at the last PAC meeting, there has been some clarification from the School District recently about what families can be asked to pay for as part of their child's education in the BC public school system. Families will see a change in some of the wording on requests for money for activities such as performances, field trips and instrument rentals. This is because we are a public school system and any activity that every child is expected to participate in is considered "mandatory" and therefore free to access. If there is a cost for a school activity then that means that it is not mandatory, and parents can choose to opt their child out and not pay the fee.

If a family opts their child out of a non- mandatory activity such as a field trip or a whole school performance and does not pay, then an alternative educational opportunity will be provided while the class and the teacher participate in the activity. This alternative may be independent study in the library or the office for the day, depending on the age of the students, how many students will not be participating in the activity and which teaching staff and space are available.

The school district has a financial hardship policy, which means the Board of Education is committed to ensuring that no school-age student will be denied an opportunity to participate in a course, class or program because of an inability to pay fees. Parents and guardians unable to pay some or all school fees are invited to speak to their child's teacher, school counsellor, and/or the school Principal.

Please note:

- Deposits are charged for JUMP Math workbooks and the deposit can be refunded at the end of the school year if the workbook is returned in good condition and can be used the next year by another student.
- Under the School Act, there can be a rental charge for musical instruments for a student's personal use. At Jamieson, every child can use a violin in class. If they do not pay for the rental of the instrument, the violin will stay in school. If a student wants to take the violin home, or chooses to play the cello, there will be a rental fee for the instrument.

Be aware that if a lot of families opt out of an activity and the money collected by the school does not cover the cost of the activity, the activity will be cancelled. If you have any questions about fees and funding, please do not hesitate to ask your child's teacher or the Principal, Ms. Thomas.

EXTENDED ABSENCES

Please note that the Vancouver School District has an Administrative Procedure if families take their child out of school for more than 20 consecutive days during the school year. <u>ap 300 admission to school.9be67c14473.pdf</u> Section 9 of AP300 states:


- 9. Rules Respecting Withdrawal of Students After 20 Consecutive School Day Absences:
- 9.1 Students who have never attended by the end of the first week of school in September will be withdrawn, unless a prior arrangement has been made with the school Principal.
- 9.2 School Principals have the authority to withdraw any student who is absent for more than 20 consecutive school days.
- 9.3 When determining whether or not to withdraw a student who has been absent for more than 20 consecutive school days Principals may take the following factors into consideration:
 - Family circumstances
 - Availability of space for waitlisted catchment students at full schools
 - Other relevant factors
- 9.4 Withdrawn students do not have continuing status at their former school.
- 9.5 Once withdrawn, an enrolment application to their catchment school is required for students who wish to be readmitted.
- 9.6 If a space is not available at the time of application, the student will be placed on a waitlist for their catchment school and placed at another school within the District

Jamieson Elementary is a full school with waitlists at every grade, so be aware that it is possible that your child or children will lose their place at Jamieson Elementary if they are absent for more than 20 consecutive school days for a reason other than illness.

SAFE ARRIVAL & STUDENT SIGN IN/OUT PROCEDURE

The Vancouver School Board has a safe arrival protocol district wide. If your child will be absent or late from school, please phone the school to report this absence as early as possible. Parents should leave a message on the dedicated answering service by calling 604-713-5367 and when prompted enter school code 1, prior to 9 am on the first day of the absence. Upon calling the Safe Arrival/Absence reporting phone line, you will be asked to leave a message and will require the following information:

- First & last name of your child (please spell the last name)
- Grade
- Division
- Reason for absence
- Date & length of absence



Late students:

If your child is late for school (arriving past 9am), they will need to be signed in on the student sign-in sheets on the table located near the cupboard of trophies.

Student Sign-Out Procedure:

When you pick up your child during the school day, please visit or call the office upon arrival at the school. The office staff will then ask you to complete the student sign out sheet. If your child returns throughout the day, please follow the same procedure to sign them back in.

LUNCHES AND UTENSILS

We kindly ask for your cooperation in ensuring that your child's lunch is packed in their backpack before school.



If you plan to drop off lunch for your child, we request that you tell them to collect it from the bench outside the office when lunch starts at 12:10pm. Please label the lunch with your child's name and division and leave it on the bench across from the office. Please do not wait to give it to them or deliver it to their classroom.

For any lunches ordered and delivered through a meal delivery service, we cannot sign for the delivery. Tell the driver to leave it on the bench outside the office, clearly labeled with your child's name.



Additionally, we encourage the use of eco-friendly utensils with lunches. Please ensure your child has the utensils that they need to eat their lunch. We have a very limited supply at school that has run out recently.

VPD AND ROAD SAFETY

Our grade six and seven safety patrol student leaders have received training from the Vancouver Police Department (VPD) Road Safety program. They have started their safety patrol shifts and will be outside before and after school, ensuring students cross the road safely at Tisdall and 48th Street. **We have already had reports of drivers failing to stop at the crossing and their licence plate has been reported to the VPD.**



The VPD have been on Tisdall Street speaking to drivers about dangerous and illegal parking and letting children out of the car on the road. On 49th Avenue the VPD has pulled over many drivers turning left from Tisdall Street at pick up and drop off. I have been told that the VPD will now be handing out tickets to drivers breaking the traffic laws.

Please do not walk through, let your child play in or run through the staff parking lot. It is unsafe and can be busy at certain times of the day.

RE: Pedestrian Improvements at the Intersection of Tisdall & W 46th Ave Annie B. Jamieson Elementary School



The intersection of Tisdall St & W 46th Ave will be upgraded with a marked crosswalk and drop ramp. These additions will increase the visibility and comfort of pedestrians crossing the street. These changes are expected to be implemented in Fall 2025.
