Kindergarten Registration Continues

Kindergarten registration continues into December and January. Please let any of your neighbours know that they may apply, if their child was born in 2019. The registration process will have two steps:

- Step 1: Complete the online registration at vsbapplynow.vsb.bc.ca—print out the completed registration form
- Step 2: Phone the school to make an appointment to bring in your documents (604-713-5290). At the time of your appointment, bring the completed registration form along with the required documents to your catchment school. Thank you.

Supporting documents needed:

Proof of residence in Vancouver
Child's birth certificate
Immigration documentation (if applicable)
Immunization records
Court orders/documents (if applicable)

NOTE: The registration process is not complete until you have completed both steps in the process. Priority registration for in-catchment students ends on January 31st. If we have more applications for kindergarten than we have available spaces, a draw will be held.

Outside Recess Rain or Shine

Now that the wetter and colder weather has finally

arrived I would like to add a reminder that, living on the west coast we have to always be prepared for rain showers so please remember to have your child come to school every day ready for this. A rain jacket, boots and even a change of clothes are a good idea. Children play actively outside each day, rain or shine and in the cold. It is usually the adults that are concerned with them getting wet rather than the children worrying. As I always say, there is no such thing as bad weather, just inappropriate clothing!

Thank you for supporting us in having children play outside rain or shine to get fresh air and exercise. If they are dressed appropriately, they will still have fun. As the weather becomes wetter and colder, there may be some families who need some support in acquiring the appropriate outer wear for their children. Please do reach out to me if you are in need of some supports in this regard.





Black-capped Chickadee—Birdhouse Cleaning

It's that time of year again. Time to take down your black-capped chickadee nest box and give it a good cleaning for next year. You may have noticed all the birdhouses around the school have been taken down. The students from Mr. Canning's class have been busy removing the old nesting material from the birdhouses to get them ready for next year's mating season.

We had four successful nests this past season and with an average of 6 to 8 eggs per nestbox we can safely say we've made a contribution to the black-capped chickadee population in our neighbourhood. We had a couple of eggs that did not hatch but this is not uncommon in the wild. It did, however, give us a chance to see the tiny eggs up close and to take some photos.

Nestboxes should be cleaned in order to keep unwanted parasites away from newly hatched chickadees. We simply removed the material from the box and used the garden hose to give the inside a

good rinse out. Some people will use a soapy water solution or even a mild mixture of water and bleach. I



find a good blast of water is generally enough to keep things in shape for next season. We will leave the birdhouses inside for the next few months and then hang them again in late January or early February. Black-capped chickadees will look for new nesting locations in February and March and the mating seasons runs between April and June. If you did not notice any activity in your birdhouse last season don't be discouraged. We may have been a little late in getting them up.

If there were any families that

had some nesting success, I'd love to hear from you. Perhaps your child can send me a little write-up about what they observed and how it made them feel. I know I love listening to the "cheep cheep" sound of the hungry chicks and seeing their wide-open mouths when their parents come to feed them. Happy birding everyone.


