<u>Kindergarten priority registration ends on Tuesday,</u> <u>January 31.</u> We continue to accept applications until this date. If you apply after January 31 your application

would not be included in the draw if we have more applicants than kindergarten spaces. Please let any of your neighbours know that they may apply, if their child was born in 2018. The registration process will have two steps:

- <u>Step 1</u>: Complete the online registration at <u>vsbapplynow.vsb.bc.ca</u>—print out the completed registration form
- <u>Step 2</u>: Phone the school to make an appointment to bring in your documents (604-713-5290). At the time of your appointment, bring the completed registration form along with the required documents to your catchment school. Thank you.

Supporting documents needed:

Proof of residence in Vancouver Child's birth certificate Immigration documentation (if applicable) Immunization records

Court orders/documents (if applicable)

NOTE: The registration process is not complete until you have completed both steps in the process. Priority registration for in-catchment students ends on January 31st. If we have more applications for kindergarten than we have available spaces, a draw will be held. If your child is placed on a waitlist, the district will place you in a nearby school until a space might become available at Nightingale Elementary.

Communication

All Vancouver Public Schools, along with schools throughout British Columbia, continue to use the model of reporting to parents on a regular and pre-determined schedule to communicate student learning with parents on an on-going basis throughout the school year. Parents currently receive five communications from teachers within a school year:



- a written progress report at the end of January
- a written summative report at the end of June
- a minimum of three ongoing communications of student learning in various subject areas (goal setting conferences in October were one example of this communication).

The written reports will include descriptive comments and a summary of student progress in relation to the learning standards from the BC Curriculum. The Ministry of Education have announced that there will be changes to the Reporting Order for the 2023-2024 school year. More information will be forthcoming as it becomes available.

After-School Care—KIVAN

The KIVAN Boys and Girls Club has openings for after school care and drop-in. The program picks up from Nightingale and closes at 5:30 p.m. with students being able to walk home (with permission) or picked up.

On Professional Development Days, Winter and Spring break, programs are available 5 days per week for a cost of \$50/week for members and \$125 per week for nonmembers. Summer programming is also available. For Grades 5-7 only there is Pre-Teen night every Thursday from 5:30-8:00 p.m. Parents are invited to contact bgcbc.ca and go to 'what we do' then 'clubs' for online registration. Yearly cost is \$1200 (without subsidy), however there are subsidies and sliding scales with monthly payment plans available.

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Cross-Boundary Applications

Priority registration for Kindergarten to grade 7 closes at the end of January. While we still accept applications throughout the year, and make every effort to have all of our catchment students accepted at our school, we sometimes do not have space and we will have a waitlist. All waitlisted students will be offered a space as one becomes available, *before cross-boundary students*. <u>The cross-boundary application process opens up on</u> <u>February 1st and closes at the end of February</u>. If you are thinking of applying to a school cross-boundary (including high school), please visit the <u>VSB website</u> for complete registration information.

Sustainability Grant and Seed Donation

In December Mr. Canning applied for a sustainability grant. We are happy to report that he received this grant. The \$500 grant he received will go towards gardening activities at the school.

We would also like to thank West Coast Seeds for their generous donation of seeds. The school is looking forward to the spring, the



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time when we can start to clean up our planters and garden area to start gardening again!
