Step 4 – After your assessment, you will develop a Student Learning Plan for this school year with an Advisor.

Step 5 – Your Advisor will help you register for the appropriate course(s).

- Four x 9-week quarter terms per year

- Morning, afternoon, evening, and Saturday classes
- Courses to help you complete your high school graduation requirements.
