## GRADUATION \& POST-SECONDARY APPLICATIONS INFORMATION

## Please read the following information on graduation and post-secondary applications!

To GRADUATE, student require:

- Minimum of 80 credits (20 courses) at grade 10, 11 and 12 level
- Mandatory credits= 52
- Elective credits= 28
- Minimum of 16 credits (4 courses) at grade 12 level (CLC 12 does not count).
- English 10, 11 and 12
- Math 10 and 11 or 12
- Science 10
- Minimum of one Science 11
- Social Studies 10
- Minimum of one Social Studies 11 or 12
- PE 10
- CLE 10
- CLC 12
- Minimum of one Applied skills or Arts course in grades 10,11 or 12.


## Numeracy and Literacy Assessment

- Must have written any applicable Numeracy 10 and/or Language 12 assessments.

Not Graduating? No problem! You can finish your high school diploma by taking high school courses online or at CapU or VCC! An Adult education dogwood diploma is another option!

## TRANSCRIPTS

You MUST create an account with STUDENT TRANSCRIPT SERVICES (or you won't be accepted)!

1) Create a BCeID (PEN \# required- 9 digit)
2) Set up account with STUDENT TRANSCRPT SERVICES and select the COLLEGES/UNIVERSITIES you may apply too. Make sure you "ORDER" them (no charge) on the final step. They will then be able to access your transcript electronically.

## FOR STUDENTS APPLYING TO UBC AND SFU:

Please note, UBC and SFU have a second language requirement for admissions: *

- SFU: "Intro" Grade 11 second language
- UBC: Grade 11 second language
*Note: Second language requirements may be waived if a student has a learning disability or designation or is an ELL learner with supporting documentation. In addition, a waiver request form for extenuating circumstance can be submitted before February $15^{\text {th }}$ for consideration.


## EXTERNAL SECOND LANGUAGE CREDIT

Students who attended a school in another country (in a language other than English) may be eligible for an External Language credit (4 credits). If you completed the following grades in another country:

- Grade 7: may be eligible for grade 10 credit
- Grade 8: may be eligible for grade 11 credit
- Grade 9: may be eligible for grade 12 credit
*The grade 11/12 external language credits meet the second language requirements for SFU and UBC.


## SECOND LANGUAGE CHALLENGE EXAM

Students fluent in another language can write a challenge exam. Only the language which are part of the BC curriculum are eligible. This exam is held once per year on Saturday in January in Delta, BC. Contact counsellor asap for details on fees. Applications due in October.
*Passing a grade 11 or 12 level challenge exam meets the second language requirements of SFU and UBC. Exams can only be taken once.

## EXTERNAL CREDITS

An external credential is one that has been developed outside the Ministry of Education and is earned by students either:

- External Language Certificate 10, 11, 12 (4 credits each)
- Athlete 10, 11, 12 (4 credits each)
- ICBC Driver Education Course 11 (2 credits)
- Bronze Cross/Lifesaving 11, 12 (2 credits each)
- Royal Academy of Dancing (Level 6-8)10, 11, 12 (4 credits)
- Royal Conservatory of Music (Level 6-8) 10, 11, 12 (4 credits)
- Ski/Snowboard instructor
- Other instructor/coach or certifications may be eligible

## TYPICAL ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS EXAMPLES for SFU or UBC (*always check websites)



SCIENCE must have:

- English 12
- Pre-calc 12
- Chemistry 11 and Physics 11
- Science 12: at least one or two science 12 's*

BUSINESS must have:

- English 12
- Math 12 (Pre-Calc 12 for UBC)
- Other Business related courses recommended (if available)
ie: Accounting, Economics, Marketing, etc.

ARTS/SOCIAL SCIENCES/HUMANITIES must have:

- English 12
- Pre-calc 11 or Foundations of Math 11
- Math 12 or Science 12 or Computers 12* (SFU only)
- Second Language 12 or other grade 12 course

NURSING must have:

- English 12
- Pre-calc 11/12 or Foundations of Math 12
- Life sciences 11 and Anatomy \& Physiology 12
- Chemistry 11 and 12 *(Check TRU/UBCO/Douglas)

FINE ARTS must have:

- English 12
- Other grade 12 courses
- A portfolio of work related to the area of interest*
- *some programs may only require a small sample of drawings/painting/sculpture, etc. Don't limit yourself from applying!
