Staff have spent a number of meetings building some strategies to support students with behaviours and competencies that can help students be successful and to keep the school a safe and comfortable place for students and staff.


What can students and families do? Here are some basic strategies and core-competencies that will help all students be successful. They are:

- Arrive to school on time in the morning and return to the school on time for the beginning of class after lunch. Often, the first ten minutes of class can be the most important!
- Use FIT time effectively to support your learning. This can include: review and preview concepts, finish up assignments, work on a project with a classmate, study or just read a book!
- Use school-appropriate language including refraining from profanity and having respectful interactions with staff and students.
- Use cell phones appropriately. As a school we have agreed that phones should be off and away during class time unless students have specific permission from their teacher.

Thank you for working together as a community to encourage the success of all students at King George. Mr. Nicks and I hope everyone finishes Semester 1 strongly and are excited to start new classes in Semester 2. Thank you!







### WEATHER FORECAST INFORMATION

VSB has procedures in place when forecasts call for severe weather, like heavy snowfall or extremely high winds. District staff monitor forecasts and conditions to assess potential impacts on school operations. They also work with the city and other school districts to inform decisions.

During severe weather events, all schools in the Vancouver School District will remain open, if possible. If a District-wide closure is necessary, that will be decided and publicized by 6:30 a.m.

Details about District-wide school closures will be announced through the media, the <u>District website</u> and school websites, as well as the District's social media channels.

### SEMESTER 1 FINAL REPORT CARD & SEMESTER 2 START DATE

Semester Turn-around days: Wednesday, February 1 and Thursday, February 2.

Semester 1 ends on Tuesday, January 31<sup>st</sup>. On February 1 & 2 are Semester turn-around days where students may be asked by staff to attend sessions to complete some final assessments.

All students are welcome to come into the building. If students want to come in, we need to provide instruction for them, but students and teachers can agree that the student may not <u>need</u> to be there. Students who are borderline passing/failing may do 'credit recovery' and other assessments with arrangement with teacher.

Monday, February 5 is the first day of Semester 2. Students and families should access MyEd BC for their schedule.

Final Semester 1 Reports Cards will be published through MyEd by the end of the day on Friday, February 9.




# KING GEORGE CLUBS 2023-2024
