The aim of all IB programmes is to develop internationally minded people who, recognizing their common humanity and shared guardianship of the planet, help to create a better and more peaceful world. The 10 learner profile attributes are Inquirers,

Knowledgeable, Thinkers, Communicators,
Principled, Open- Minded, Caring, Risktakers, Balanced, and Reflective.




The Learner Profile attribute for the month of November was **Inquirer**. Students nurture their curiosity, developing skills for inquiry and research. They know how to l e a r n

independently and with others. Students learn with enthusiasm and sustain our love of learning throughout life.

The Learner Profile attribute for the month of December is **Risk-taking**. The IB Learner Profile aims to develop students who are risk-takers. This means guiding students to explore new ideas and innovative strategies, challenging their ways of thinking and encouraging them to be confident in those decisions. This lifelong skill requires students to step out of their comfort zone and become courageous in their choices and actions.

As an Inquirer, I ask a variety of questions.I show persistence, I don't give up easily when seeking answers.I have a genuine appreciation for learning for its own sake.I use all senses fully. I conduct research independently.







Making the MYP Connection at School

At Roberts, students learn and practice the many ways we inquire and take risks. Through inquiry, school works to ignite passion, inspire relevance, and develop



ownership in their students. Using student inquiries and questions as guidance, teachers developlessons that engage and excite, teaching their students to be active thinkers rather than passive learners.

Making the MYP Connection at Home

So how can you successfully encourage your child to take risks and be resilient in the face of challenges?

- Communicate effectively and listen actively.
- Provide resources and learning opportunities for children to explore their interests, sparks and abilities.



- Accept children for who they are and help them to set realistic goals and expectations.
- Help children to experience success by identifying their strengths and learning from failures.
- Recognize a child's capacity, maturity, common sense, and learning and communicate the message that "you have everything you need to succeed."
- Encourage and practice good communication skills such as starting conversations and debates about current events.
- Help your kids develop research skills online and from text.
- Enjoy building projects together.
