

Making Your Start Successful

There are a number of things you can do to make your start successful.

- 1. Please read over this August newsletter and refer to our Magee website for information on school opening policies and procedures.
- 2. Pay attention to the information that will be given to you in **homeroom** the first week of school. After that week you will be expected to be familiar with the **procedures** and **rules** contained in the agenda book.
- 3. Use your **agenda** to help you plan and organize (the book will be available after school fees have been paid). It is an invaluable tool!
- 4. Remember you don't have a second chance to make a first impression. Make that first impression a positive one. Ask, if you need help. People at Magee are caring and will help you if you need it.

School Growth Plan 2024 - 2025

Our school's overall **growth plan** continues to emphasize student engagement, initiative and leadership within a culture of care and support. Our school goals are:

- 1. To encourage and enhance positive physical and mental health in our learners, and
- 2. To increase knowledge, acceptance, empathy, awareness and appreciation of Aboriginal histories, traditions, cultures and contributions among all students.

School Opening Schedule

The 2024 – 2025 school year starts on Tuesday, September 3rd with a homeroom period (homeroom room locations are posted in the atrium - **NOTE – homeroom assignments can change from year to year!**

<u>Grade 9-12 students</u>: 10:00 - 10:30 am. New grade 9-12 students who enrolled prior to August 29, 2024 will have had a homeroom assigned and should report directly to their homeroom, as shown on the lists in the atrium.

<u>All Grade 8 students</u> will report to the rotunda by 11:00 am. They will be met by administrators, counsellors, and the **grade eight homeroom teachers** who will take them to their homeroom. Grade 8's will learn how to navigate their new school environment from their homeroom teachers and through the leadership of our Peer Counselling 12 Students

Homeroom Period for ALL STUDENTS in Grades 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12

- Wednesday, September 4th from 8:40 am 8:55 am; Semester one schedule, period one starts at 9:00. Day ends at 3:00 pm.
- Thursday, September 5th from 8:40 am 8:55 am; Semester one schedule; period one starts at 9:00. Day ends at 3:00 pm.

- Friday, September 6th. No homeroom; regular timetable and schedule (see p.7)!

During mandatory homeroom periods teachers take students through important school procedures, routines, and policies. The framework that guides decision-making for all Magee students, staff, and greater community is our school's **Student Code of Conduct** which is reviewed during our homeroom periods.

During the first week of school, students will meet their teachers and new classmates for the year, classroom-learning goals will be established along with important homework expectations.

Should you have any questions for your child's teacher, or grade counsellor, please contact them directly. We encourage you to take time during this important first week of school to review with your child a program of strong work habits at school and home that will set him or her up to maximize their educational opportunities.

Your child's Magee **Student Agenda**, which will be distributed during the homeroom periods, also contains useful information including the Magee Student Code of Conduct and school routines, policies, and procedures.

Attendance

As you know, prompt, regular **attendance** to class is an essential ingredient for your child's success at school. We encourage families to continue scheduling any important medical appointments, etc., outside of class time.

Attendance is taken in each class and recorded. Parents/guardians of students who are absent due to illness are asked to send an email to magee@vsb.bc.ca excusing their child's absence. Send the email to your teacher as well.

Make sure to add the following: Student's full name / Student number / Date(s) and classes you were absent for / Reason for Absence

The VSB is continuing a Flexible Instructional Time (FIT) schedule this school year. FIT is a period of instructional time built into a school's schedule that gives students the opportunity to have choice in their learning time. Examples of some ways to use FIT time include:

- meeting with teachers for support in subject learning or completing assignments
- attending tutorial sessions
- connecting with counsellors
- collaborating with other students on projects
- individual time to study or enrichment passion projects
- completing Career Life Connections 12 and Capstone requirements
- Work Experience 11 and 12.

Ultimately, FIT time encourages our students to take ownership of their own learning and gives them the opportunity to develop core competencies such as personal responsibility, self-regulation, goal setting, wellbeing and communication.

The FIT period is on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. Our daily schedule, adjusted for FIT time and standardized across the district is available on page 7.

You will notice that the school day starts slightly earlier and ends slightly later than in the past. This allows the introduction of monthly collaboration time for admin and teachers to meet and collaborate on unit and school planning, and examine emerging best practices and growth opportunities in teaching. Collaboration dates and times are also noted on the schedule on page 7.

School Fees

A list of school and supplemental fees may be found on the school website. Students will receive 'Student Account Summaries' during the first homeroom on September 3, 2024. We continue to use School Cash Online, to facilitate payment of school fees. We look forward to continuing to use this system and we appreciate your help in significantly reducing the amount of paper our school consumes. Please register by visiting the VSB's School Cash Online website. Your child's first name, last name and birth date are required for registration. Once registered, an email notification is sent when items become available for purchase online. For support, technical help or additional information, please contact the School Cash Online parent/guardian help desk bv visiting helpdesk.supportschoolcashonline.com or on 1-866-961-1803.

Further information on school and supplemental fees and the online payment of those fees is also available on the school website. School Cash Online will be available for parent registration as September 11th. School and supplemental fees will be collected through School Cash Online <u>starting the second week of classes</u> and not during the homeroom periods as in the past. Parents wishing to pay fees by cheque or cash will be permitted to do so in the office.

Parents, please make a note of the district's **Financial Hardship Policy** which recognizes that some families may not be able to fully afford school fees. Board policy is that no student of school age will be denied an opportunity to participate in a required course, class or program because of financial hardship. Parents/guardians unable to pay some or all of a school fee are invited to speak to their child's teacher, school counsellor, and/or administrator (Financial hardship application forms are available through the school office). All financial hardship applications and discussions shall be confidential. Ways in which difficulties in meeting requests for payment of school fees may be addressed include: partial payment, waiver of the fee, payment by instalment, and/or fundraising activities to reduce overall costs.

Communication

Communication of school news and events is done primarily through email with our 'Magee News' ebulletin. A '**Student Information Verification Form'** will be distributed during the Tuesday September 3rd homeroom period. Please verify this form and make any changes/updates directly onto the form. Please also ensure there is a Parent/Guardian email address listed on the form. The form is to be returned by students at the Wednesday, September 6th homeroom or to the office in the first week of classes.

School Photos

School Photos will be taken on Tuesday, September 24th. Identification cards are included in your School Fees. All students **must** be photographed for a Go Card. Go Cards must be shown as I.D. for BC Transit.

Physical Education

Magee Lions PE clothing is available for *purchase* from the P.E. Department. While this purchase is optional, *the P.E. department strongly recommends this purchase*.

The majority of high schools in the district have adopted a P.E. strip policy (similar to Magee's) to promote school pride, enhance personal hygiene, and to ensure students are appropriately clothed for physical activity. (Common strip amongst the students also helps promote student safety and quick identification of Magee students when moving about the greater community during P.E. activities.)

If students choose not to purchase this optional Magee Lions P.E. clothing, the department asks that students wear <u>red</u> <u>and/or black athletic strip</u> (following our school colours). **P.E. clothing purchase and distribution takes place** during the first week of classes directly from **P.E. teachers**.

The purchase of Magee Lions P.E. clothing is an especially helpful organizational tool for Grade 8 students, as they may continue to wear their Magee Lions strip in Grade 9 and 10 PE classes (or purchase replacements as required). The department asks all students to please **label their clothing** on the tags inside the shirt, shorts, or sweat pants.

Please note that family members are also more than welcome to purchase any of the clothing for themselves to share their school spirit! Strip is available through the P.E. office during school hours.
