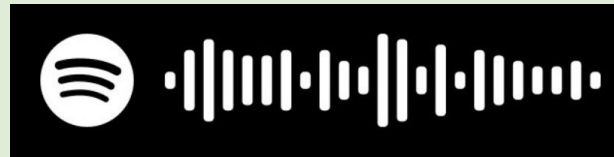

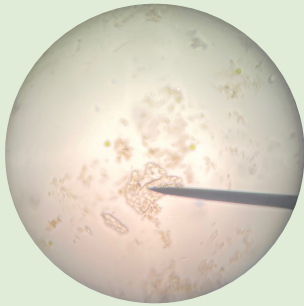
Before he leaves for Harvard, he wants to spend some more time exploring the unknown side of Vancouver and living life to the fullest.

BIOLOGY AT ITS FINEST

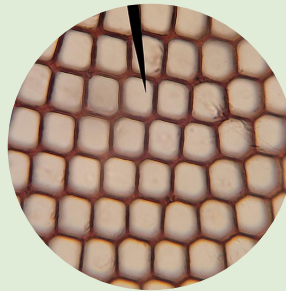

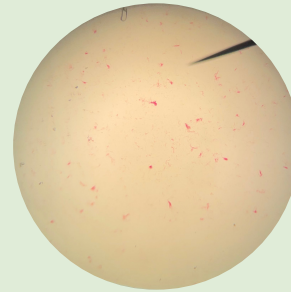
Algae slide

Bacteria slide

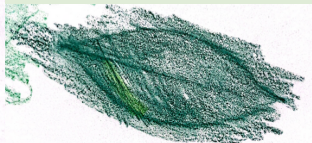
WANT TO TRY THIS AT HOME? : 'DIY' MICROSCOPE SCANS



WHAT YOU NEED

- Pencil crayons
- A hard surface
- A piece of paper
- Something you want to create a 'scan' of

FINISHED PRODUCTS OF LEAF 'SCANS'



INSTRUCTIONS

1. Put your object under a piece of paper.
2. In order to prevent the paper from moving, you may want to tape down the edges or hold on very firmly.
3. Use your pencil crayon to lightly color over your paper.
4. It should create a detailed outline of whatever is underneath the paper.

Of course, extremely detailed scans are best produced under a microscope in the science lab. However, the task only takes a few minutes, so we encourage readers to try it at home.

For the spring edition, our team has compiled pieces of digital media, woodworking, metalworking, painting, and collage-work to be enjoyed and admired.

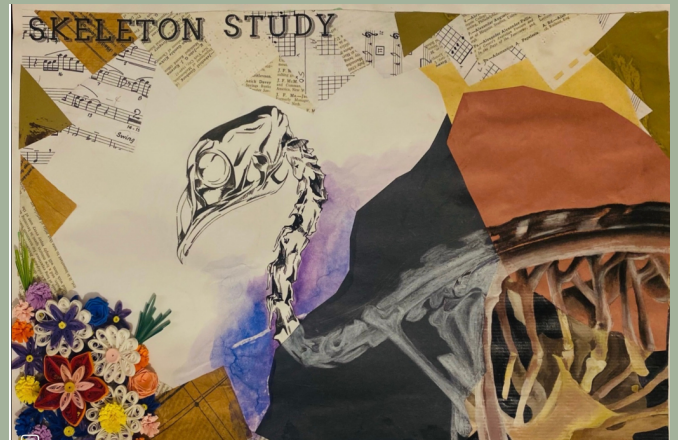
These works come from various classes. As the spring term includes both semester 1 and 2, works come from classes in both semesters.

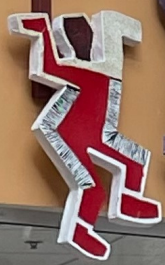

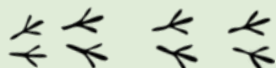
CHICKEN NOODLE SOUP

(Recipe by
Ms Grier)



Instructions

1. Bring a medium pot 3/4 full of water with a pinch of salt to a boil.
2. Add the pasta and cook it for about 8 minutes. *Keep the pasta slightly undercooked, as it will continue to cook in the soup broth.*
3. In a large pot, heat up the margarine, all the cut-up vegetables, and salt and pepper.
4. Sauté for 3-5 minutes or until the onions have a little bit of color.
5. Add the chicken broth, water, chicken broth powder, spices, and raw chicken cubes. Bring this to a boil.
6. Cook for 5 minutes then reduce heat and add the pasta.
7. Simmer for 10 minutes and season to taste.



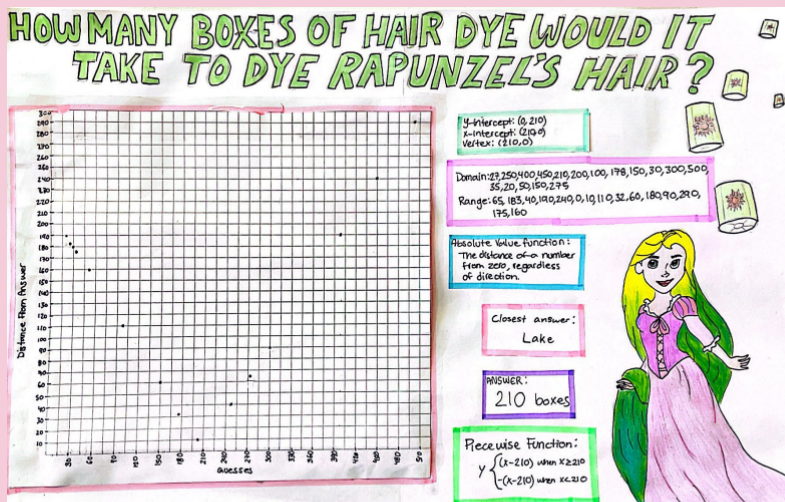
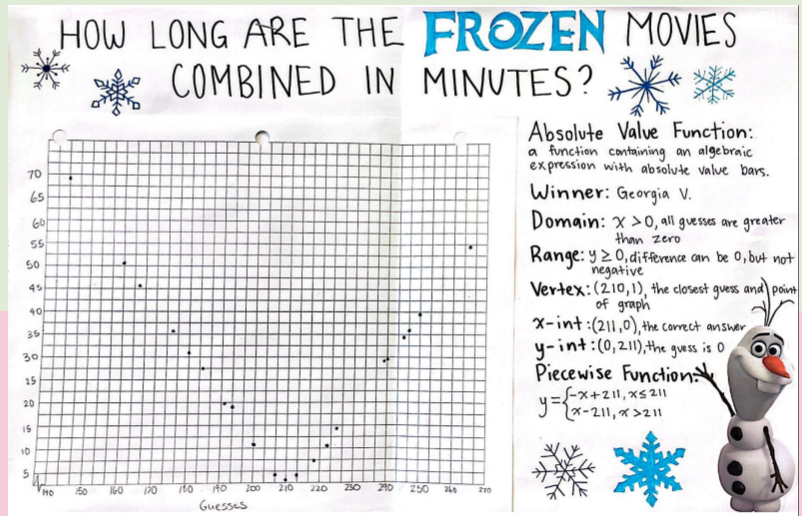
Ingredients

- 250 mL of small-shaped dry pasta
- 1 ½ chicken breasts, cut into bite-sized pieces
- 15 mL of margarine
- 1 medium carrot (diced)
- 1 celery stalk (sliced)
- 1 small onion (diced)
- 1 green onion (sliced)
- 2 cloves of garlic (minced)
- 500 mL of chicken broth
- 500 mL of water
- 15 mL of chicken stock powder
- 1 bay leaf
- 5 mL of dried parsley
- Optional: 1 sprig of fresh thyme or fresh rosemary



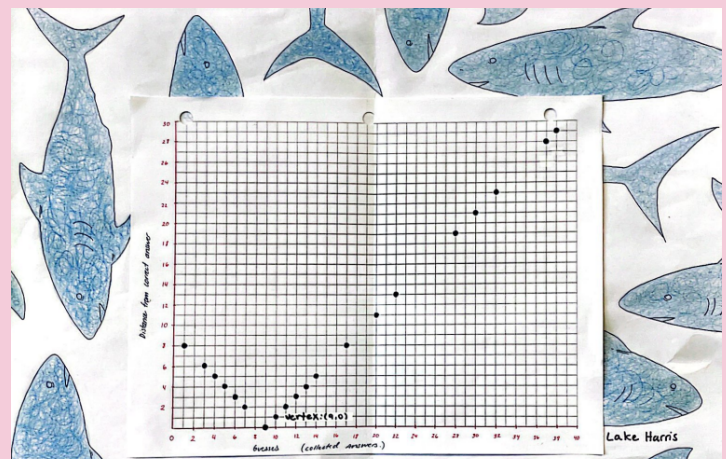
LET WINTER GO, IT'S TIME FOR SPRING!

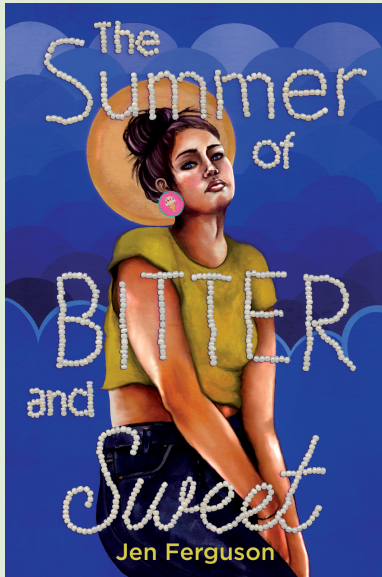

The Summer of Bitter and Sweet (2022)

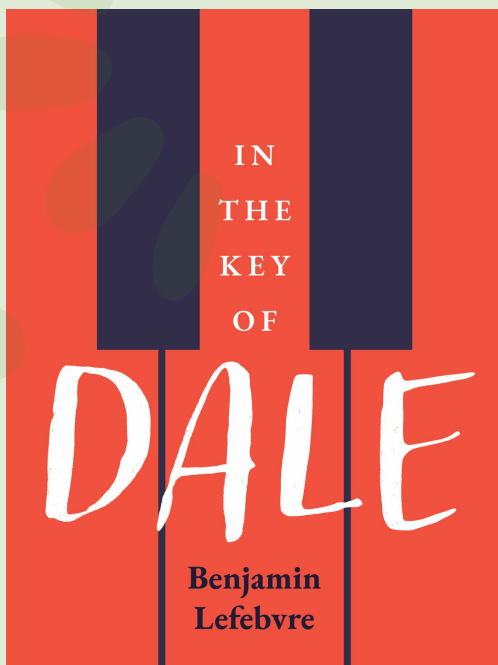

Heart-rending and healing; a winning blend that will leave readers satisfied” (Kirkus review).

The main character Lou grapples with issues of sexuality, broken family relations, revisiting childhood friendships, witnessing and helping with bipolar disorder, the effects of racism and more. All of the characters are complex and the story is a tour de force, a true coming of age narrative.

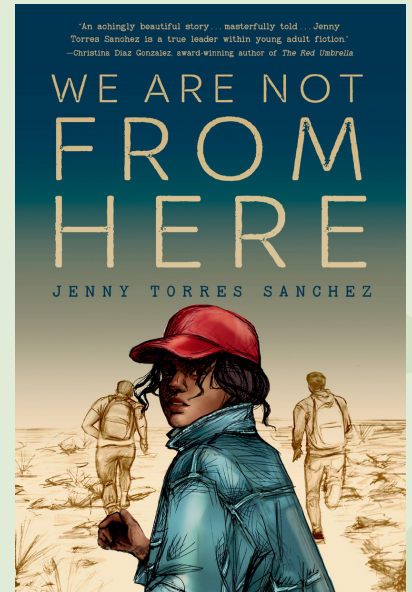
In the Key of Dale (2022) By Benjamin Lefebvre



Sixteen-year-old Dale Cardigan is a queer, teen, music prodigy who lost the only parent he felt he could relate to, and so begins writing to his dead father as a way to express all of the things he cannot say to his mother. Dale, as a character, celebrates all the geeks, loners, musical prodigies and high school students who were unapologetically true to themselves in spite of the pressures to conform in high school. Like many seniors, Dale endures school and his present home, just waiting for his real life to begin. A quirky, funny, complex coming of age story that is sure to delight from beginning to end.

We Are Not From Here (2020)

Jenny Torres Sanchez's, *We Are Not From Here* (2020), chronicles the travels of teenagers Pulga, Chico and Pequeña crossing from Guatemala through Mexico enroute to a "better life" in the US. They follow the infamous route of La Bestia, and while there's no denying that the trek on La Bestia through Mexico is traumatizing on various levels, it's also important to point out that this novel is full of hope, complex characters and dynamic twists and turns. A timely and needed read for everyone is our world dealing with unprecedented global migration and the perils inherent therein.



the 9:09 Project (2022) By Mark H. Parsons



Jamison Deever's mother passed away at 9:09 pm, when he expected the world to also stop spinning on its axis. Two years later, a junior in high school, Jamison finds his memories of his mother slipping away—the date of his mother's birthday for example. He decides to use the gift his mother gave him—an appreciation for photography, especially that of Dorothea Lange, and his Nikon camera—to honour her memory. He takes to the streets to shoot footage, and what develops is a journey that focuses his grief, forges a new outlook on life, builds new friendships and even allows him to reconnect with the family that remains alive to him, his father and younger sister. This is a thoughtful exploration of grief, healing, loss, hope, joy and sharing one's perspective.

From a Kirkus review: this novel is "a wryly funny, extremely intelligent, and sweetly romantic contemporary novel full of biting sarcasm and threaded through with tender yet powerful emotions; Parsons asks the readers] to consider questions of meaning and value in their own lives."

SWEET N' SIMPLE SUGAR COOKIES

A delicious treat!

Sugar cookies are one of the easiest cookies to bake as they are finished in only a few simple steps. This spring, *The Voice of the Lion* recommends readers to bake some sugar cookies when spending time with friends or family, maybe even have a decorating competition.

Prep Time

20-30 mins

Oven Temp.

375 °F

Bake Time

8-10 mins



INGREDIENTS

- 125 ml of margarine
- 185 ml of sugar
- 1 egg
- 3 ml of vanilla
- 435 ml of flour
- 1 ml of salt
- 7 ml of baking powder
- 30 ml of milk (optional for a softer cookie)

1. Set oven to 375 °F.
2. Prepare pans by lightly greasing with Crisco.
3. Cream the margarine with an electric mixer until it is very soft.
4. Add the sugar and cream.
5. Add in egg and vanilla and beat until it is smooth.
6. Add in sifted flour, salt, and baking powder.
7. Form the dough into a ball and divide in half.
8. Roll out each portion of dough to 1/4 inch thick on a lightly floured surface.
9. Cut into desired shapes.
10. Bake 1" apart on a baking sheet.
11. Decorate to your liking!

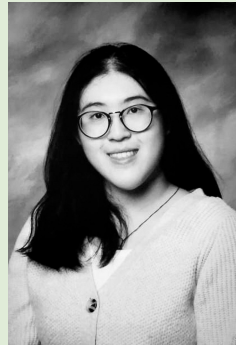

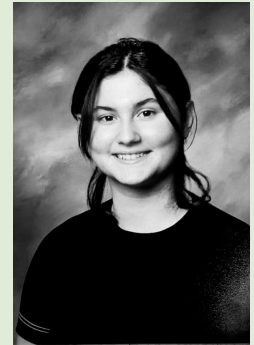

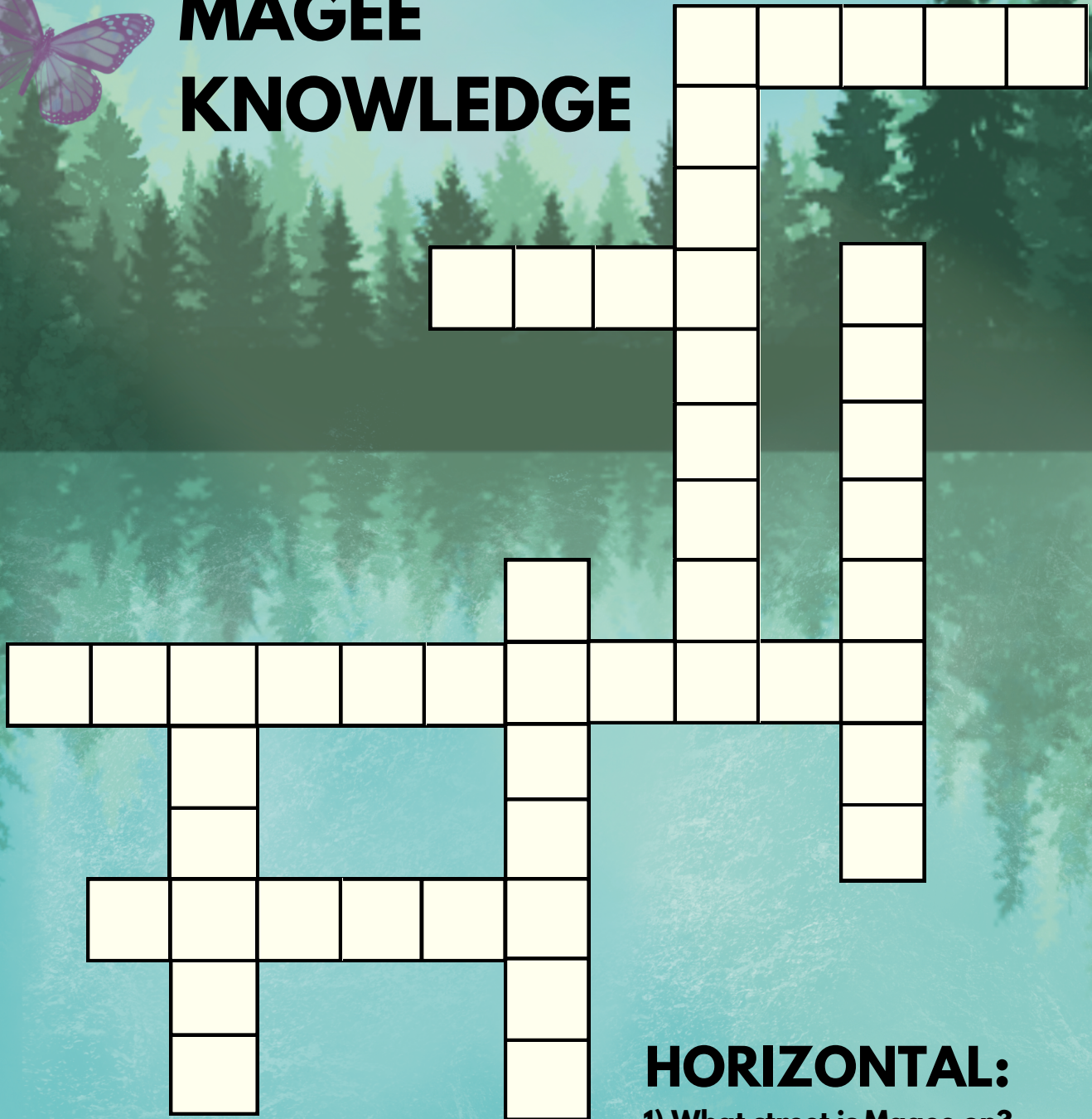
