### **2025 Canadian Computing Competition**

Hounds Shine in the 2025 Canadian Computing Competition!

In mid-February, 29 brave Hounds took on the challenge of the 2025 Canadian Computing Competition, organized by the Centre for Education in Mathematics and Computing at the University of Waterloo. For most, it was their first experience with such a rigorous contest, and all participants should be proud of their efforts in tackling this demanding test of programming and problem-solving skills.

The preliminary results are in, and several standout performances deserve special recognition. In the Junior difficulty level, **Vasilii Orlov, Paul Peng, Georgina Tse, Phillips Vu** and **Ben Gibson** delivered strong scores, finishing just behind the top performers. Meanwhile, in the Senior difficulty level, **Bill Nguyen** dazzled with expertly crafted code solutions that were only eclipsed by Point Grey's top performer, **Hugh Wong**, who achieved an impressive result that was just shy of the standard to receive an invitation to the next round of competition, the Canadian Computing Olympiad. Next year will be an opportunity to reach even greater heights of achievement.

### Grade 10 Literacy Assessment April 7 - April 11, 2025

The Grade 10 Literacy Assessment is a provincial graduation requirement that evaluates students' literacy skills, including critical thinking, analysis, and communication. It is not tied to a specific course but assesses learning across all subjects from kindergarten to Grade 10.

### **Information for Grade 12s Taking Online Classes**

A quick reminder to students taking an online class that is required for university admission: students should check when that course needs to be completed. The 50% deadline is approaching for UBC & SFU. Students will need to ask their online provider to add the mark into MyEd **prior to March 14**. \*This does not always happen automatically.

- <u>UBC & SFU-</u> 50% of the course must be completed, and an interim mark must appear on your ministry transcript by March 15. \*March 15 is a Saturday, and we need to upload the marks to the ministry site so please have interim marks entered before March 14<sup>th</sup> into MyEd.
- **UVic-** completed by June 30
