The first day of school is Tuesday, September 5^{th} with returning and new students in grades 1-7 students in session from 9:00-10:00 am. Returning Queen Elizabeth students report to last year's teacher/classroom. Newly registered students report to the gym and will be directed to a temporary class with their peers. Beginning on Wednesday, September 6^{th} , school is in full session from 9:00 am - 3:00 pm, for students in grades 1-7.

On Tuesday, September 5th, new Kindergarten students, report outside the B building (by the primary playground). Kindergarten families should refer to the gradual entry schedule in the letter emailed home to them in early June. Kindergarten students will continue on a gradual entry schedule from Tuesday, September 5th to Tuesday, September 12th. Beginning on Wednesday, September 13th students will be in full attendance from 9:00 am 3:00 pm.

School Fees ~ 2023-2024

General \$35.00 Supply Fee:

The Vancouver School Board offers the service of purchasing basic school supplies in bulk at wholesale prices and passing the cost savings on to families. The School Supply Fee for 2023-2024 is \$35.00 per student.

This fee covers basic consumable school supplies used for students' personal use such as paper, writing tools, glue sticks, erasers, exercise books and art supplies. Supplies are provided for the full year.

Supplementary Fees:

Students at Brock will be using an Agenda/Planner in grades 1-7. School agendas/planners are a valuable tool for teaching children how to organize and plan for school. While students are not required to have an agenda/planner it is designed to assist students with the skills of organization and time management and is a very useful communication tool often used between teachers and families.

Performance Fee – TBA (where applicable)

This supplementary fee supports the school in bringing in talented and professional theatrical and musical performers that align with a particular educational theme. As performances are arranged, parents may be asked to contribute. The typical cost per student per performance is \$5-8.

Activity Fee - \$50.00

During the school year, and as permissible under Provincial and District Health and Safety protocols and direction, non-curricular activities may be offered to students with nominal fees. Program fees will be published at that time.

Outdoor Education - \$50.00

Throughout the year, students may be participating in outdoor education activities such as, gardening and nature sketch.

Workbooks/Online Supplemental Resources -\$40.00

Students in some divisions will be bringing home a Math/Language Arts Practice and Homework Book. This material supplements the classroom math/language arts program. Other classes will be using on-line supplementary resources. This material supplements classroom programs.

The workbook is available for purchase at the cost of \$40.00. Students are not obligated to purchase the workbook, and may opt to use their copy as a reference textbook instead, meaning the workbook will be returned at the end of the school year for another student to use in the future. Students opting to use the workbook as a textbook will be responsible for ensuring that it remains unmarked and in excellent condition in order to return the workbook at the end of the year.

Grade 7 Fee - \$50.00

Grade 7 students are involved in events that help foster team building, leadership and friendship skills. This supplementary fee supports the grade 7 Farewell and related activities.

Field Studies - To be determined throughout the school year at the classroom level

Throughout the school year, and as permissible under Provincial and District Health and Safety protocols and direction, your child's teacher may plan supplementary learning opportunities at locations outside of the school and request monies towards entrance fees, transportation or equipment rental. Your child's teacher will communicate this information to you directly.

Financial Hardship

As a reminder, the Vancouver School Board will not deny a child access to the school supplies required for his or her educational program because of financial hardship. Nor will any child be excluded from activities where a fee is charged. If at any time there is a financial challenge, please contact the school Principal, Mrs. Paget. All requests will be treated confidentially.

A <u>Notice of Late Return Form</u> is to be completed for any student expecting to return to school LATER THAN noon on Wednesday, September 6th 2023, but prior to Friday, September 29th, 2023.

Please note: If the school is unable to verify your child's attendance at school <u>by</u> noon on Wednesday, September 6th, 2023, your child's space will be given to another student on the school's waitlist.
