### Dogs on School Grounds - What are the rules?

The Vancouver Board of Education adopted a 'Dog Code' to describe the conditions for pet owners to bring their dogs onto VSB sites and our grounds are marked sites with signs indicating the rules.

The Dog Code stated:

- Dogs are permitted on school property weekdays 6-8 AM and 5-10 PM, and on weekends\*
- Dogs are not permitted on school grounds or playfields at any time while organized play is in progress.
- Dogs must be on leash at all times on school property.
- Dog owners must pick up and remove waste.
- Owners must not allow their pets to dig holes or otherwise damage property.
